Ronnie served on the Food Bank board beginning in 1995 where he anchored his compassion to help others in the food bank's mission of combatting hunger. Combined, Ronnie leaves a lasting legacy of over 30 years of service to the people of West Central Texas. I could not be more grateful for his service to our neighbors across the area.



This year has brought other meaningful transitions, too. We've launched initiatives designed to better serve our partners, constructed new spaces to feed and engage our neighbors, and invested in tools and talent to prepare us for what lies ahead. These are not just operational shifts. They're signs of our collective momentum in the fight against hunger.

Change can be challenging, but it also invites creativity, resilience, and reinvention. I'm proud of how our team, partners, volunteers, and supporters continue to embrace transformation, not as disruption, but as progress toward our shared mission of ending hunger. In Coleman County, 1,520 individuals are food insecure. This includes 390 children. Coleman County also is a food desert because it lacks grocery stores, especially in the rural parts of the county. The only grocery store available to residents is the Shoppin' Baskit Food Center located in Coleman.

To feed Coleman County, we were delighted to receive a grant from the Community Foundation of Abilene and Coleman County Foundation to support our on-theground partners working each day to take care of our neighbors facing hunger. The grant helped support food and equipment costs.

Partnering with the Food Bank has allowed us to access low- or no-cost food, expand our pantry services to reach more households, and offer a wider variety of nutritious foods. With the grant, we received a double-door metal freezer. It's a totally fantastic donation — I can almost fit two cows in it!

As shared by Hanna Adams, Board President, the funding "gives us the flexibility to respond quickly to specific needs in the community, whether it's for seniors, families with young children, or individuals facing unexpected hardship. Overall, this support will help us reach more people, more often, and with greater nutritional value."

COMMUNITY FOUNDATION

The grant also supported the Santa Anna Mobile Pantry, where in Santa Anna, nearly 20% of the population lives below the poverty line. Once a month at First United Methodist Church of Santa Anna and Christian Family Ministries of Coleman County, the Food Bank delivers food at no cost to the sites.

Together, with the Community Foundation of Abilene, Coleman County Foundation, and our Feeding Coleman County partners, we are fighting hunger and feeding hope. Do you live in Coleman County?
