As we look back on this past year, we do so with deep gratitude for the faithfulness of God and for the way He continues to form us—not just as a growing church, but as a people learning to live the life of Jesus together.

2025 has been a defining year for The Point. Not because of any single milestone, but because of a growing clarity around who God is calling us to be. This year, we leaned more intentionally into discipleship—into shaping lives marked by trust in Jesus, love for others, and faithful presence in our communities.

This year also marked meaningful progress in preparing space for future ministry. We completed renovations at our Ridge Street Campus and began worshipping together there in November, while continuing investments across all our campuses created environments where children, students, and adults can encounter God and grow in faith. These spaces are not the mission, but they serve the mission by making room for people to be known, formed, and sent into the world as apprentices of Jesus.

None of this happens without a church willing to trust God together. Your generosity and trust are shaping lives in ways that will echo far beyond what we can measure. Thank you for saying “yes” to God again and again.

As we look ahead, we do so with confidence—not in our plans, but in God’s presence among us. May we continue to become a church rooted in love, formed by Jesus, and faithfully engaged in the work He has placed before us.
