

Qualification Reform Demonstration Project: Active Volunteering Get Involved!



HumanAbility is examining the volunteering qualifications within the CHC Community Services Training Package through a demonstration project which will road-test a new approach to qualification design.

This project will investigate the potential for broader vocational learning that will support people to volunteer across a range of sectors including health, welfare, emergency services, environment, animal welfare, sport and recreation, and community groups/services.

HumanAbility will explore the skills and knowledge required for volunteers across these sectors and examine how the national training system can best support the training of volunteers. We will also identify alternative approaches to the volunteering-related qualifications to identify how these may be developed for a vocational learning program.

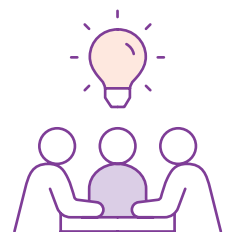
The project seeks to respond to the changing needs of workplaces and industry, moving away from a one-size-fits-all approach.

A Project Reference Group has been established to provide expert advice for this project and a consultation strategy has been prepared to engage a diverse range of stakeholders.
