Residents prioritize these threats and evaluate the importance of community involvement in addressing these concerns. In addition, survey takers are asked about their interest in participating in developing the proposed community center, and their priorities when it comes to their neighborhood.

Usage Description: This document is pivotal for understanding the primary safety concerns of residents and their expectations from community initiatives. It guides the development of tailored safety measures and emergency protocols by identifying the most pressing threats and gauging the community's reliance on collective actions for security. In addition, the final questions of the document is important for understanding involvement and interest in community center development participation and neighborhood priorities.
