Wimbledon School of English offers a high-standard academic environment built for serious learners aged 14 to 17. Grounded in a "London as your campus" philosophy, the programme blends classroom learning with real-world immersion across one of the world's most dynamic cities.

Students are pre-tested and placed into classes by English level, supported by experienced educators, specialist facilities, and a flexible textbook system that ensures every learner has what they need to succeed. A minimum 80% attendance requirement keeps standards high throughout.

SOCIAL PROGRAMMES

Students enjoy a fully supervised schedule of daytime and evening activities throughout the week. Weekly highlights include Pizza Night, parties and afternoon sports in Wimbledon covering rugby, cricket, football and beach volleyball. Cultural visits span London and beyond, with guided tours of Westminster, iconic museums, a Thames River cruise, and full-day trips to Oxford, Windsor Castle and Brighton.



ACCOMMODATION & DINING

Students stay at Surbiton Halls Residence in London, offering single en-suite rooms in a comfortable university-style setting, or in homestay accommodation in the Wimbledon area with single or shared room options. All students receive breakfast, packed lunch and dinner daily at the Wimbledon School of English campus, with tuck shop access and dietary requirements catered for.



STUDENT WELFARE

Student safety and wellbeing are prioritised at every level. A dedicated team of trained staff, Welfare Managers, first aiders and safeguarding-certified leaders is present throughout the programme. All accommodation hosts are DBS-checked and strong supervision ratios are maintained at all times. The programme also holds close ties with local doctors and hospitals to ensure prompt support whenever needed.



Integrated Academic & English Learning

Through interactive English classes covering reading, writing and speaking, students build fluency and cultural awareness. The Future Business Leaders track uses project-based learning and real-world case studies to develop marketing, finance and leadership skills.

Excursions

A guided London programme bringing learning to life through visits to the British Museum, Westminster, Buckingham Palace and Tate Modern, with cultural stops at Covent Garden and Camden. Full-day trips extend to Oxford, Windsor Castle and Brighton.

Creative Enrichment (Plus Courses)

Weekly electives let students deepen language skills through real-world subjects. Options include hands-on filmmaking from storyboard to screen, a deep dive into London's cultural and sporting heritage, and public speaking workshops focused on voice, structure and confident delivery.
