



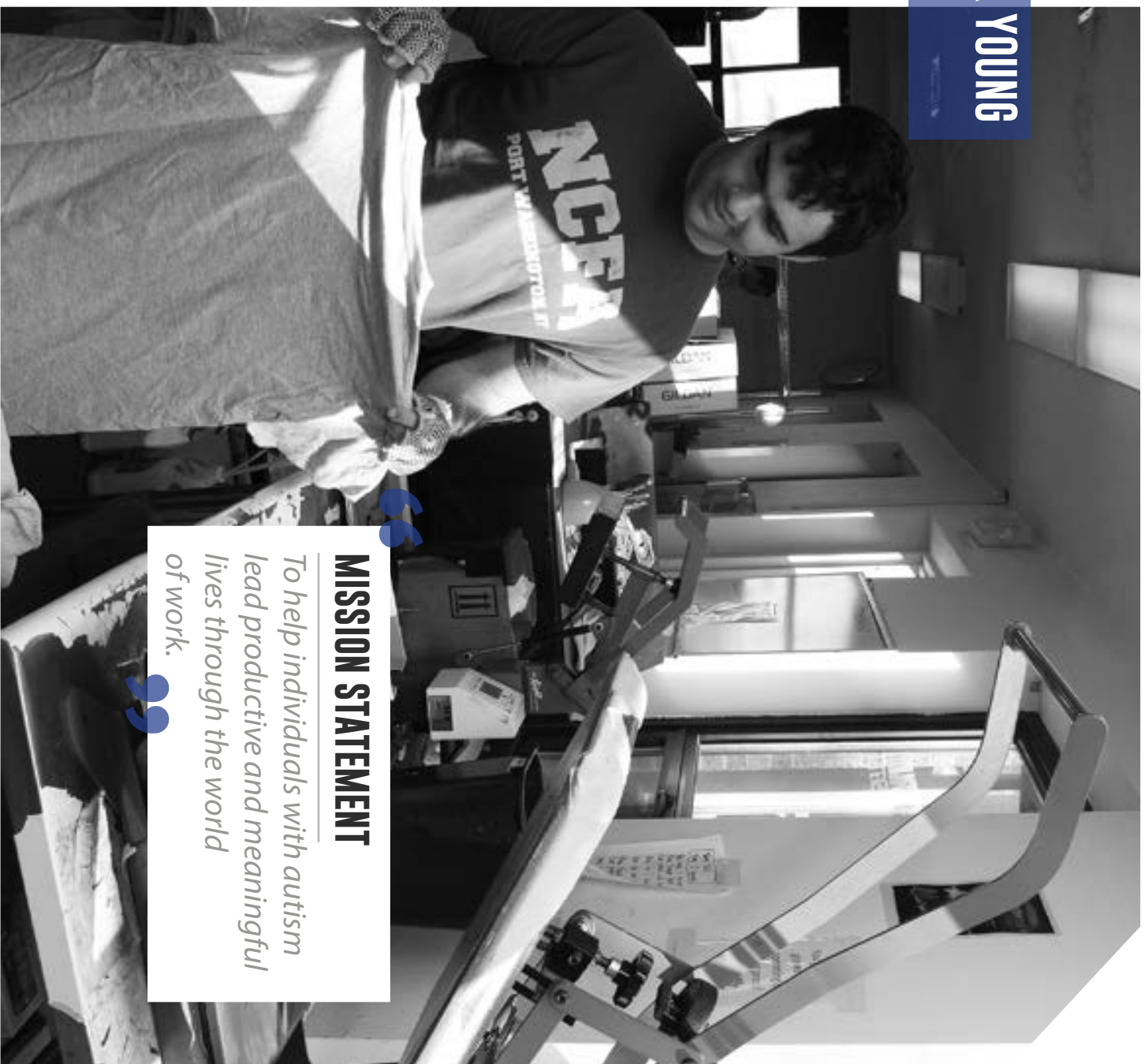

Letter from our Executive Director

Dear friends,

2015 will likely be coined as the year Spectrum Designs went 'Automatic'. Following a tremendously generous anonymous donation of \$40,000 at the end of 2014, Spectrum Designs upgraded its screen print technology to include a fully automatic print press. By doing so, production capacity dramatically increased by 500% and with the new technology Spectrum was able to improve consistency of output in quality of products printed. Contrary to some concerns about 'automation', this upgrade in equipment created more hours of direct labor for our employees by increasing output capacity and allowing Spectrum to be more competitive on price, volume and consistency.

The effects of the new machine and growth in sales were quickly felt and we were proud to hire two new full time employees; a screen print machine operator and a direct to garment machine operator through ACCES-VR. The success and speedy acclimation of both of these hires was largely due to the hard work of the skilled and trained staff at The Nicholas Center who remain a crucial resource and support for many of our employees with disabilities. Quite simply, Spectrum Designs would not be anywhere near as successful as it has been at employing teens and young adults with developmental disabilities without the special relationship it has with The Nicholas Center. We also increased our number of direct labor hours of paid employment to adults with autism almost one hundred percent. This increase means going from 3,081 paid hours of disabled employment.



in 2014 to an estimated 6,008 in 2015. We finished the year setting our sights on securing a permanent home for Spectrum Designs. We launched the Believe Capital Campaign and identified a location steps from our current building on lower Main Street in Port Washington. With the support of our dedicated network of families, donors and customers we remain confident this dream will become reality. The space will be 7,000+ square feet, serve as a flagship for Spectrum Designs and will allow us to open our doors much wider to teens and young adults with autism. That ultimately, is what it's all about.

SOCIAL ENTERPRISES

EXPANSION

Each day, Spectrum Designs strives to help more people with autism enter the workforce. In 2015 with the help of the Nicholas Center we broadened our base to pilot 3 new businesses, Spectrum Bakes, Spectrum Grows, and Spectrum Suds. This opened up more opportunities to local teens and young adults and diversified our offering to individuals already served.



Spectrum Bakes offers a variety of handmade, customizable granola based products. Every item is made to order and handcrafted with the finest natural ingredients. These delectable culinary treats are sold as party favors, in local stores and as corporate gifts. Some of our customers include Marra & Glick ABA, Allan T. Mendels, CLU and The Jack Fanning Memorial Foundation.



The team at Spectrum Suds offers laundering services for customers within the local community. Each participant learns to wash, dry, fold and steam various articles of clothing, towels, sheets and comforters. Repeat customers include Prism Med Spa residents at Dolphin-Green Apartments and a growing base of private clients.



At Spectrum Grows, we home-grow fresh microgreens and herbs. Spectrum Grows has a greenhouse where herbs, tomatoes, basil and a variety of micro-greens are hydroponically grown. The team is responsible for germinating, watering, and harvesting produce, before preparing it for delivery. Trays of micro-greens are delivered to Northwell Hospital in Manhasset on a weekly basis, in addition to our neighborhood on the Harbor. We hope to expand to local restaurants as we grow!

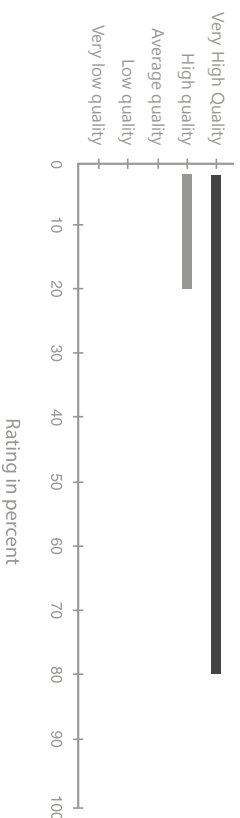

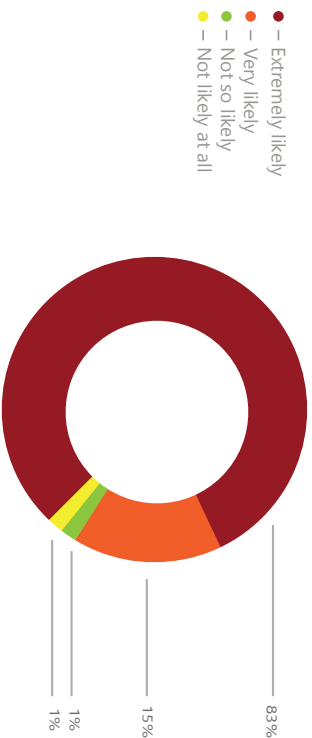

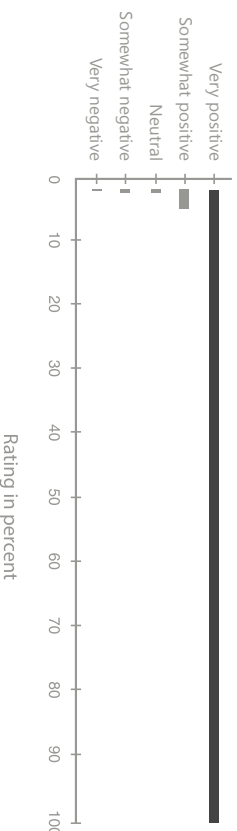
HOW WOULD YOU RATE THE QUALITY OF OUR PRODUCT

BELIEVE, BUILD, BELONG TO A LEGACY

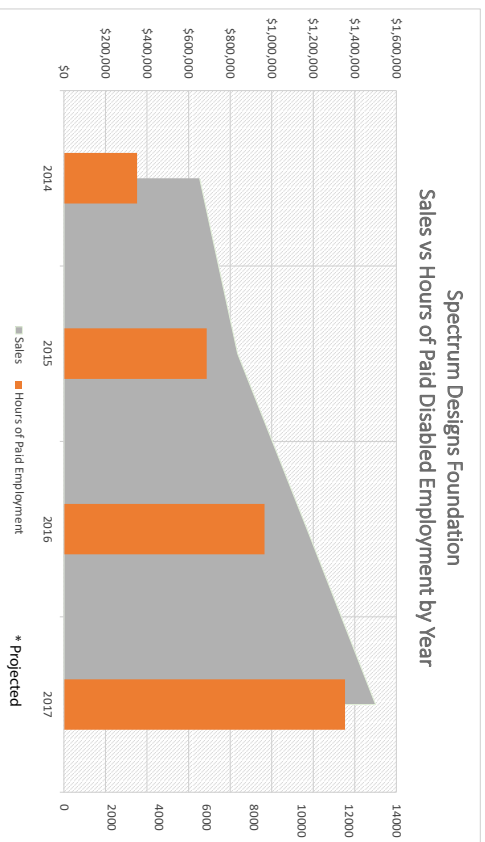

In 2015 we raised a total of \$89,046 towards this campaign which gave us a strong start for 2016.

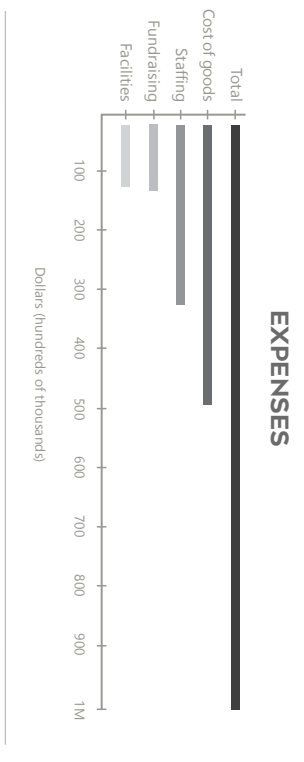
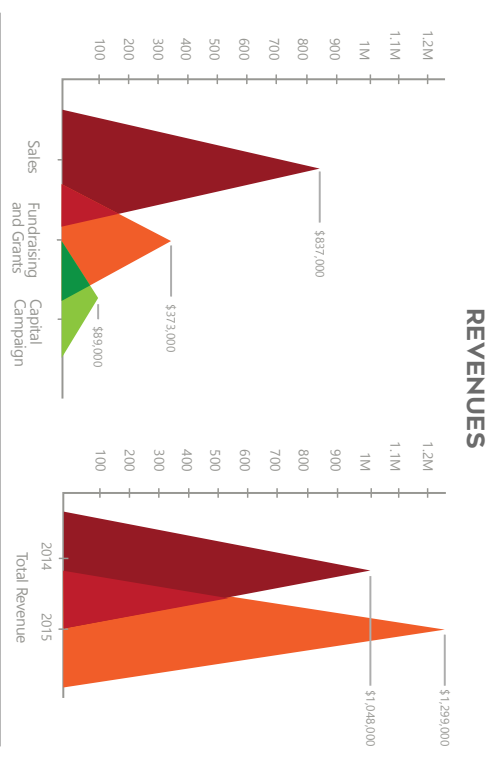
