



Its inaugural assignment was a multi-year market system development initiative in collaboration with the DFID and SDC-funded Katalyst project, which played a pivotal role in shaping Bangladesh's seed market landscape. In 2009, Innovision embarked on its first international assignment in Afghanistan, marking its expanding footprint beyond national borders. Subsequently, the company was formally registered in the UK in 2014 and in Nigeria in 2019. As of 2025, Innovision proudly celebrates 17 years of impactful service and achievement, having successfully completed 500+ projects in 22 countries around the world.


