Understand geographical similarities and differences through studying the human and physical geography of a small area of the United Kingdom, and of a small area in a contrasting non-European country. <b>BANGLADESH.</b>			
Human and physical geography	Autumn	Spring	Summer
Identify seasonal and daily weather patterns in the UK. Locate hot and cold areas of the world in relation to the Equator and the North and South Poles. Identify seasonal and daily weather patterns in the UK. <b>WILD WEATHER.</b>			
Use more basic geographical vocabulary to refer to key physical features and human features. <b>ALL TOPICS.</b>			
Geographical skills and fieldwork	Autumn	Spring	Summer
Use world maps, atlases and globes to identify the UK, its countries, counties. <b>BIG, WIDE WORLD.</b>			
Use simple compass directions. <b>WILD WEATHER.</b>			
Use aerial photographs and plans to recognise landmarks to devise a simple map. <b>BIG, WIDE WORLD.</b>			
Use simple fieldwork and observational skills to study the geography of the key human and physical features of the schools surrounding environment. <b>ALL TOPICS.</b>
