WHAT IS "GLAZING"?

Glazing, or Layering is a technique in watercolor that involves applying thin, transparent layers of paint over dry layers. This lets the color underneath show through, creating depth, luminosity, color harmony and muting of bright colors.

TIPS...

- Use a large soft brush and keep brush strokes gentle and to a minimum.
- Start with pale glazes as it is easier to darken rather than lighten.

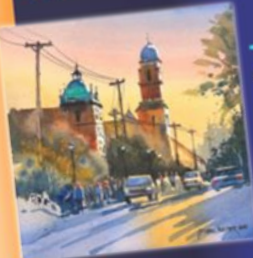

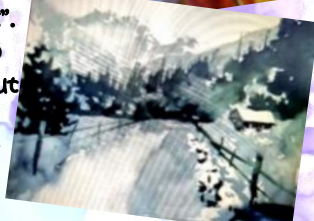

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Jan. Demo Notes David R. Smith

Captured us with his engaging presence, friendly interaction, and of course, his Bob Ross hat. He worked on 140 lb. rough Fabriano Artistico. He made "half marks" on his drawing, found reference points, & established the vanishing point from which his one-point perspective radiated. He also sketched a smaller "value study", which is a very important part of his process. He works from his own photos, both a color and B&W. Paper is not taped down but both sides are moistened to prevent buckling and puddling. There are three basic values—lights, mids and darks. He started by laying in the lights, or "toning". He used Escoda Perla brushes that come to a sharp point—one in good condition, and one old he uses for blending and softening edges. He generally prefers using the white of the paper, with a few exceptions of final details. He moves his board between a 5-10 degree incline and wipes the back of the paper as he lets each layer dry (this prevents unwanted blooms). The paint consistency is also important for each layer, starting from a "tea" to "coffee" to "milk". When he is ready for the mid tones, he goes to his value study and paints with B/W, picking out shapes and values, using that as a rough draft before working on the large painting. He does this with the dark tones as well. David uses negative painting to define shapes (this is the area around the objects). IT IS IMPORTANT TO: use colors that are in the same value range you are painting, remember that high contrast & hard edges draw the eye, have a good variety of textures using dry brushing, splattering, sponges, and let the medium work its magic.
