What Is A Signature Member?

The Signature Membership Program recognizes individual artists as having achieved a high level of artistic watercolor painting skill. Once signature membership is attained, an artist may include the initials "SWS" on their signature line behind their name. This program was established in 2017 and qualified members were first recognized at that year's annual meeting.

How do I become a Signature Member?

A signature membership (in accordance with our bylaws) is currently awarded to regular members who have earned **9 points within ten consecutive years** by participating in our juried "Member Shows" and/or juried "National Shows".

JURIED MEMBER SHOW ----- 1 point earned*
JURIED NATIONAL SHOW ----- 3 points earned

***NOTE: an individual may only accrue a maximum of 3 points toward signature membership by participating in Member Shows.**

Mixing Greens with Sue Rohrbach



One of our signature members, Sue has been ranching over 50 years, in addition to teaching at Spokane Art School. Sue enlightened us as to some of her "sneaky tricks" to save time & money, the value of practice (having a sketch book handy at all times) and keeping records of your color mixing. She believes tube greens must always be mixed to achieve a natural hue, and that **neutralizing** is very important in attaining representational colors. Preparation before painting is key. Determine the "mother color" (the color of an object before light or shadow is applied), determine your color scheme based on time of day, atmospheric conditions, light intensity, warm and cool, etc. AND always adjust according to your needs. Organize your palette into color families and label everything. She also shared her remarkable sketchbook. Check the SWS website for her recorded demo, if you missed it, or just to review.
