SWEET VIBURNUM

KNOCK OUT ROSES


These bushes can grow up to 6 feet tall. They are bush shaped and come in a variety of colors to add just the perfect pop of color to your landscaping areas.



DRIFT ROSES

Drift roses are on the smaller side, averaging under 3 feet in size. They are arching and sprawl over groundcovers. You can find them in a variety of colors as well, and even some with a fragrant smell such as the Coral Drift and Sweet Drift. Homeowners like these roses particularly due to the fact that they are significantly "less thorny".

Sweet viburnum as pictured here on the right can grow up to 20 feet tall. It's a full, beautiful, and perfect for our warm, sandy soil.

Drought Stress



Drought stress occurs when warm season grasses are actively growing but rainfall and irrigation do not meet the plant's water requirements. The grass then enters a drought-induced dormancy to protect itself. Signs of drought stress include grass thinning and losing color.

Some helpful hints...

- Rapid evaporation makes watering in the middle of the day wasteful.
- The best time to water grass is in the early morning.
- Wind and heat are usually minimal at this time, and the majority of the water will reach the lawn.
- ** If you must water during the day, the grass will not be harmed.
