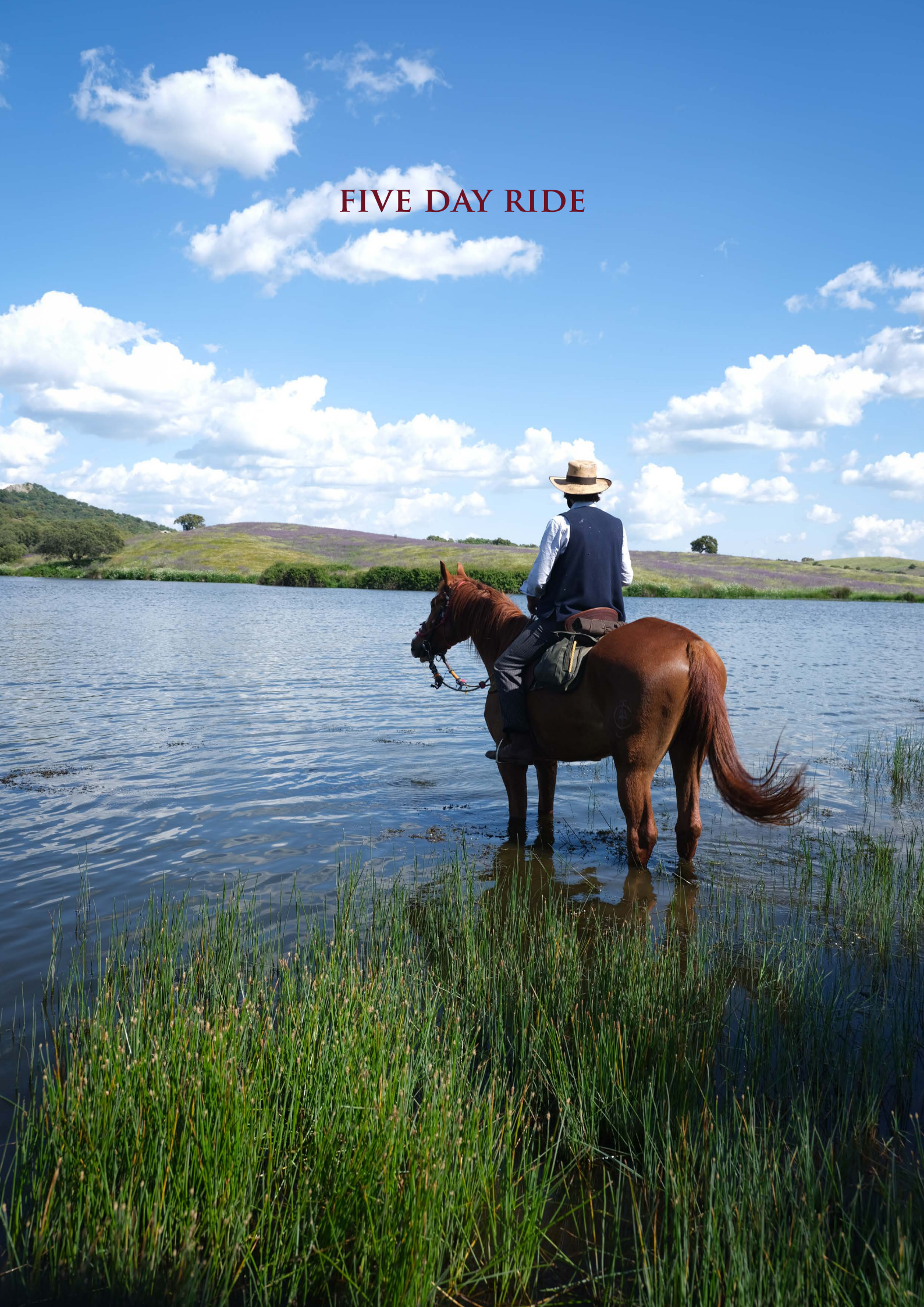


FIVE DAY RIDE

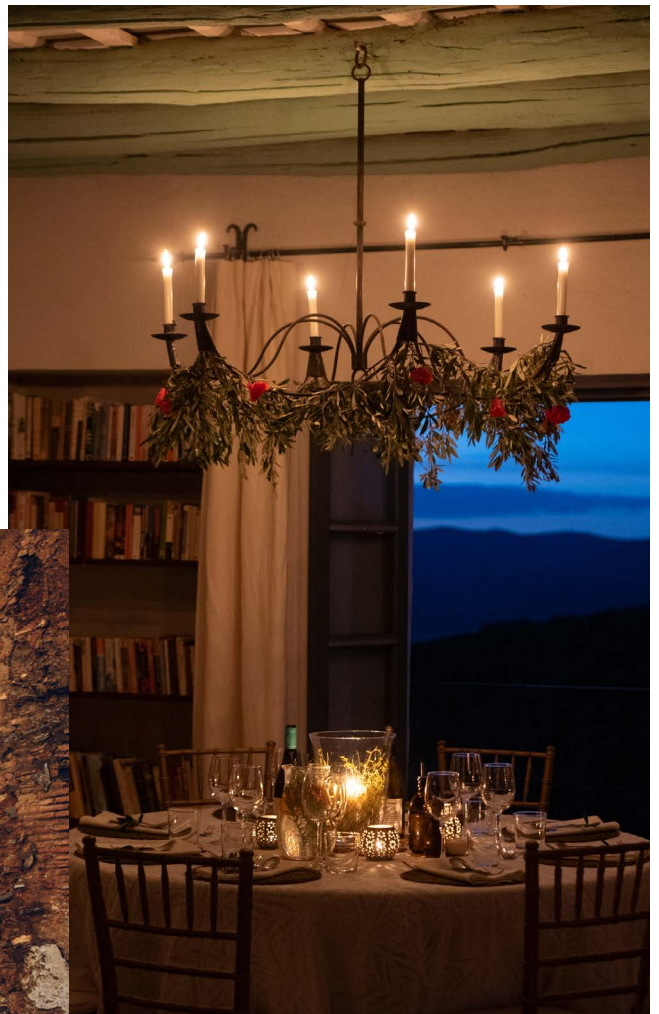




Huddled in the stunning Sierra Morena mountains natural park near Cazalla de la Sierra, Taramona, a crumbling 16th-century farmhouse, offers an enchanting beginning to your five-day ride. Overlooking a picturesque valley, Taramona is powered by solar energy and illuminated by fire torches, hurricane lamps and candles.



Dine inside an old olive mill, where saddles adorn the walls, or in another charming corner of the house, before retiring to one of the bedrooms scattered throughout the candle-lit building. One of the unique sleeping quarters is Taramona's chapel, where the bed is positioned under an altar. Luxurious Egyptian cotton linen, plump pillows, and hot-water bottles during the colder months ensure the most blissful of nights.



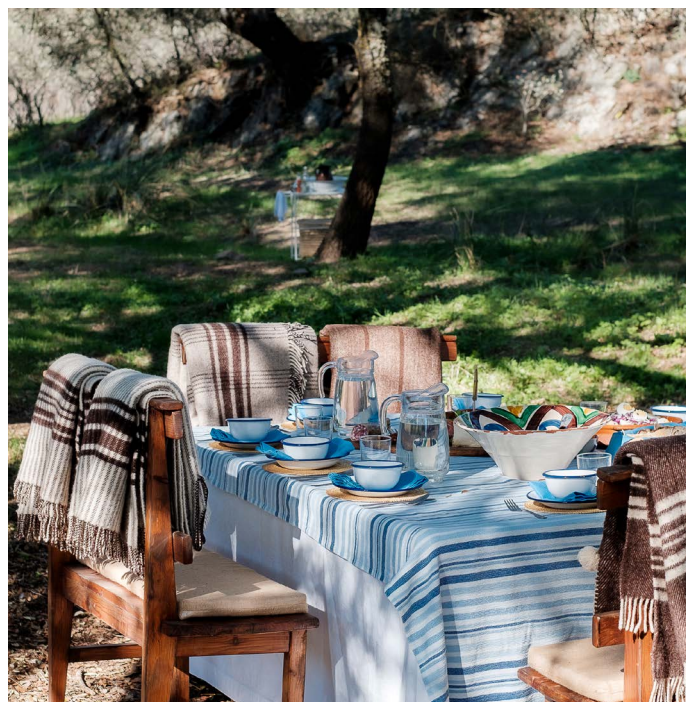
After a hearty breakfast, you'll embark on horseback along old cattle-driving routes and bridle paths meticulously selected by George to reveal a hidden Spain that few ever experience. This journey is like reading a perfect book: the gentle pace, the captivating scenery, and the element of surprise – each chapter revealing more beauty. Soon, a near-silent landscape will envelop you, with only the sound of hooves on cobblestones or the call of birds breaking the tranquillity. Keep an eye out for eagles, griffon and black vultures, flycatchers, bee-eaters, red and fallow deer, wild boar and, if you're fortunate, the rare Iberian lynx.





A delightful surprise is in store. As you round a corner or crest a hill, you'll come upon a magical scene: a beautifully laid table beneath an Indian canopy, a fully stocked bar offering aperitifs, and a lunch featuring Jamón Ibérico and other locally sourced delicacies. All of this is arranged in a location selected for its remarkable beauty and breathtaking views.

In the evening, you'll be staying at one of two locations, Trasierra or an ancient farmhouse we take on for the season. Nestled in the mountains, Trasierra is a cherished 15th-century



family estate where George grew up. It offers a blend of opulent yet homely comfort, with gardens and walls adorned with orange trees, figs, aloes, flowers, herbs, wisteria and roses.



You'll enjoy a sumptuous dinner and sleep soundly in beds as soft as clouds. In the off-grid farmhouse, dine by candlelight and sleep in a charming corner of an ancient building, far from the din of roads and civilization.

The next day, return to Taramona by a different route, discovering more of Spain's pristine natural beauty and wildlife. That evening, experience a new dining setting in another part of the



house. As night falls, you'll settle into soft cotton sheets, tired yet content, your mind filled with the sights, sounds and scents of the real Spain.

On the final day, you'll enjoy a half-day ride to a scenic spot – a promontory overlooking a valley, an exquisite ruin or perhaps a clearing in beautiful woodland. This last ride will be the culmination of all that you've so far experienced – a memorable view and a lunch to savour, and a grand finale to your trip into the heart of hidden Spain.





IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Safety

Guests' full medical insurance is required and policy details must be submitted prior to arrival. The mobile camps, vehicles and guides have mobile phones and tracking systems in case of an emergency and we can get a car to any point of our ride in a maximum of 30 minutes. Your safety is imperative to us.

Medical

A small medical kit is carried on horseback and a more comprehensive kit is kept in the vehicles. However, this is limited, so we ask guests to bring any required medication with them.

Riders

Every rider is required to fill out a personal information form stating their level of experience which will be assessed before any guest is accepted. A signed indemnity form is also required before your adventure. Our weight limit is 95 kg.

Non-riders

Non-riding spouses/friends/family are most welcome. We can arrange a series of activities for them depending on their interest. This can range from cultural, to gastronomical, to sport-ing, etc... Or you can simply enjoy the different properties and their surroundings and be left to your own devices.

Horses

Our horses are mainly Anglo-Arab's, Hispano-Arab's and Andalusians. Our preferred saddles are "Potrera" saddles which are a mix between a western and english saddle. They have been carefully chosen for this type of riding and the well-being of the horse. We can also provide english saddles upon request.

How to get here

Our closest airport is Seville which is an hour and 15 minutes away from Taramona. A shared transfer from a collection point in Seville at 4 pm is included on your date of arrival. Departures on Sunday are from 4 pm onwards to whichever destination you require in Seville or the airport. It is also possible to organise a private transfer for 150€.

Weather

Seasonal rains can happen in Spring and Autumn in this part of Andalucia. Typically the 'long rains' fall between the months of February and March. However, we can expect occasional rain showers throughout the year. Temperatures range from 10C to 30C in Spring and Autumn.

Tipping

The recommended tip is 20 € per person per day.



PACKING LIST

We recommend you wear neutral colours or khakis and browns. Generally the nights are cold and the days are warmer. During the winter and late autumn months we recommend you bring warm clothing for the mornings and nights. In the Spring, temperatures become much milder. We provide you with waterproof capes and woolen ponchos if necessary.

Your luggage is forwarded by car to each location so feel free to pack generously. You will be provided with saddle bags on your horse to carry any personal items such as a camera/phone/medicine/powerbank e.t.c.

Please bring:

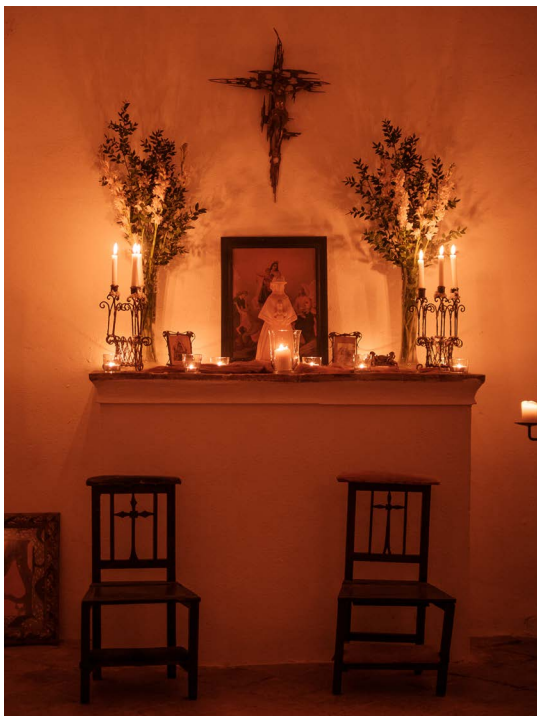
- Sun hat

- Something warm for the evening

- A portable charger (we can also provide one if necessary)

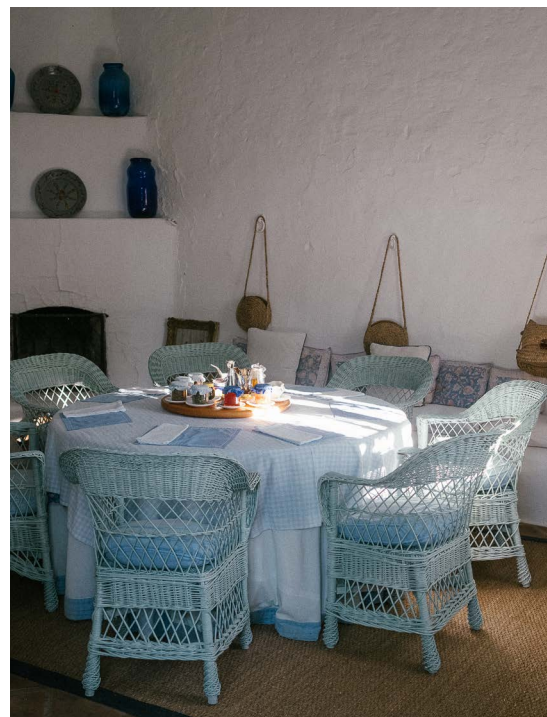
AN ANCIENT FARMHOUSE

During the season, we take on some of the most beautiful and ancient farmhouses (or cortijos, as they're known in Spain) in the area. These are buildings that have been abandoned for decades, and have remained perfectly untouched ever since, like memorials to an ageless way of life. We tread lightly in them, ensuring their magic is preserved while providing you with all the comfort and luxury you'd expect. The buildings are lit by oil lamps and candlelight, while bedrooms are furnished with proper beds, soft Egyptian cotton and plump pillows, hot-water bottles for the colder months, bedside tables, luggage racks and hot-water bucket showers. You'll find a fully stocked bar on site, and dinner is served by candle light in a dramatic setting to maximise the theatre and atmosphere of these historic buildings.



TRASIERRA

Nestled in the mountains near the town of Cazalla de la Sierra, Trasierra is a beloved 15th-century family property where George grew up. It's a place of unbridled but relaxed luxury, its gardens and walls filled with orange trees, figs, aloes, flowers, herbs, wisteria and roses. Each room has its own private terrace, there's a large pool to cool off in during the heat of the summer, and a bar for cocktails and sundowners. Here, you'll eat sumptuously and sleep soundly in a bed as soft as a cloud on Egyptian cotton sheets and plump pillows.
