# AN OPERATIONAL GUIDE TO ACQSC STANDARDS & WHS COMPLIANCE

An unannounced visit from the **Aged Care Quality and Safety Commission (ACQSC)** is a test of real-time operations, not historical records. When auditors walk through your doors, they aren't checking if you merely have a contractor policy—they are looking for proof that you are actively enforcing it.

Every year, hundreds—if not thousands—of external risks walk into your facility via maintenance tech teams, emergency plumbers, agency nurses, and allied health professionals. It takes just a single third-party worker with an expired Police Check, unverified immunisation record, or missing induction to trigger an immediate audit failure, create a severe WHS liability, and expose your provider to devastating reputational and legal damage. To pass, your system must deliver definitive, live visibility at the perimeter.

# AUDIT FLASHPOINTS

## WHERE CONTRACTORS PUT YOUR COMPLIANCE AT RISKS

Contractor management directly impacts your ability to demonstrate compliance across multiple ACQSC Quality Standards. During an audit, critical friction points typically occur in three areas:

### STANDARD 4: THE ENVIRONMENT

- **The Audit Risk:** Auditors demand proof that external maintenance technicians (HVAC, fire, structural) actively follow infection control protocols, understand site hazards, and do not introduce secondary risks like unsecured tools or unvetted chemicals into resident areas.
- **The Site360 Proof:** Provides real-time digital evidence of pre-vetted contractors. The platform forces technicians to acknowledge site-specific hazards and infection protocols during digital check-in, turning an operational risk into a visible safety standard.

### STANDARD 5: CLINICAL CARE & VISITING PROFESSIONALS

- **The Audit Risk:** Clinical care must be safe and delivered by qualified individuals. A single visiting professional (agency nurse, physiotherapist, podiatrist) with an expired registration, missing police check, or unverified immunization status triggers an immediate compliance failure.
- **The Site360 Proof:** Acts as a digital gatekeeper by requiring pre-arrival uploads of AHPRA registrations, police clearances, and immunization histories. If a credential expires, access is automatically restricted, ensuring an unassailable defense during unannounced audits.

## STANDARD 2: THE ORGANISATION (GOVERNANCE AND RISK MANAGEMENT) THE AUDIT

- **The Audit Risk:** Governance is judged by active capability, not static paperwork. If auditors demand immediate proof of inductions, risk assessments, or credentials for third-party contractors currently on-site, manual sign-in books will not suffice.
- **The Site360 Proof:** Automates organizational governance. Instead of chasing paper during an audit, you can instantly export a time-stamped log of every induction, accepted risk profile, and approved credential directly from the system.

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## IMPLEMENTING THE "DAY ZERO" FRAMEWORK WITH SITE360

The traditional method of managing contractors—checking plastic licenses at the reception desk while managing residents and families—is a systemic **failure point**. It creates administrative bottlenecks and allows non-compliant workers onto the floor.

To pass an audit cleanly, facilities must shift compliance upstream using the "**Day Zero**" Framework. Built directly into the Site360 workflow, this methodology dictates that 100% of contractor compliance verification occurs on 'Day Zero'—before the worker ever arrives at the facility.

## STEP 1: PRE-SITE VERIFICATION

- **Credential Gates:** Contractors upload their National Police Check, NDIS Worker Screening Card, trade licenses, and public liability insurance directly into the Site360 secure portal.
- **Automated Expiry Tracking:** The system automatically flags expiring documents. If a contractor's Police Check expires, Site360 automatically restricts their profile, preventing them from checking in on-site.

## STEP 2: ROLE-SPECIFIC DIGITAL INDUCTIONS

- Generic inductions don't satisfy auditors. A contractor repairing a roof requires a different briefing than an agency nurse or an IT technician.
- Through Site360, managers deploy short, digital induction modules that contractors complete on their own devices before arrival, covering fire safety paths, resident interaction protocols, dementia awareness, and open-disclosure expectations.

# REAL-TIME PERIMETER & ZONE CONTROL



Once a contractor arrives, the system must shift from theoretical compliance to active enforcement. Paper logbooks are passive; Site360 is an active gatekeeper.

### NFC & GEO-FENCED CHECK-INS:

Uses physical NFC scanners at entry points or geo-fenced boundaries to automatically detect when a contractor enters the asset perimeter.

### THE HARD STOP:

Automatically denies entry if a worker has an incomplete induction or missing credential. This removes front-desk staff from the compliance enforcement role.

### ZONE-SPECIFIC TRACKING:

Logs workers into distinct areas (e.g., Memory Support Unit vs. Main Plant Room) rather than just the building at large, allowing you to manage resident risk dynamically.

# GENERATING THE EVIDENCE: WHAT TO SHOW THE AUDITOR

When an ACQSC auditor requests proof of your contractor management practices, scrambling to compile files from filing cabinets or disparate spreadsheets sends an immediate red flag. It signals a lack of systemic control.
