Dear All,

Schools have started back and the holiday season is over and the beautiful Autumn season is upon us. In the Church's liturgical season, she puts before us the prophets and starts to remind us of the end times and the coming of Christ. However, there is also a feeling of beginning again that is in the air – a strange paradox.

In the Old Testament Prophets were sent to explain the present in the light of God's plan and to call the people back to His ways: St John the Baptist straddles the testaments and cries out for a conversion of heart and a baptism for the forgiveness of sins for the Messiah is coming. The Prophet Jeremiah – whom we read in the Liturgy of the Hours at this time – calls the people to repent so as to avoid the destruction of the temple.

The Father to enlighten his Church and call her back to the Gospel message continues to send “prophets.” He sends his son, his mother, saints, mystics, popes etc so as to remind us of the times in the light of the eternal message. We need to pay attention to these because although they are private revelation they nevertheless serve to draw us back to the central gospel message; e.g. Jesus appears to St Faustina in order that the Divine Mercy be made known to the Church. This is only deepening our understanding of the gospel of St John when Jesus' side is opened by the lance of the Centurion and out flows blood and water. Therefore, God is reminding us that in this time of deep spiritual battle and sin when mankind has lost its way, the only door to enter through is His Mercy.

Or Our Lady appears at Fatima to warn us of the dangers of hell, the need for conversion, the need to make reparation. Indeed if one looks at the last hundred years the message is deafening. Pope St John Paul II prepared the Church carefully for these times explaining to us that we are preparing for a New Pentecost, a New Spring Time in the church characterised by a “new and divine holiness “ that is being opened up for us.

As the First Reading tells us, it is the duty of the church leaders to warn the flock of the dangers and also, what is needed spiritually in these times. The gospel message is constant – love of God and neighbour and that Christ has given to the Church all the power necessary for the forgiveness of sins and to live a life of great sanctity. Let us seek to learn and use the gifts God has given us. God bless, Fr Dominic

There are a few main pillars that I have in mind to unite the community and to ensure that all have the chance to benefit from opportunities. I will mention them briefly:

SMALL PARISH COMMUNITIES

There needs to be alongside the parish, the domestic church as we see in the Acts of the Apostles. This will be most beneficial for community, mission and prayer. It will also greatly help the priests in knowing where the needs are.

ONE SPIRITUAL PROGRAM

Allowing for initiatives particular to the individual parishes, there will also be a common spiritual course, guidance etc offered to all supported by retreat days. It is important that everyone has access to simple teaching so that they can grow in holiness. This will be based on Pope St John Paul II's encyclical “Going into the New Millenium” and Bishop Patrick's themes of Encounter, Discipleship and Mission. In particular it will focus on conversion of the heart and the role of the Holy Spirit.

ROLE OF THE LAITY

This will be essential in this new community and is something very positive that has come out of the synodal path that has been followed in the past few years. The priest now has to concentrate on what only he can provide. The laity have to help both in the running of the parishes but also in spiritual formation.

MISSION IN LINCOLNSHIRE

There is a growing desire in the wider area to foster a movement towards mission not just in our local areas but in Lincolnshire as a whole. There is something special about this county – I believe for many years it has been quite tough soil to sow in but that reaping – by God's grace – will come. Particularly a group of lay people who would like to come together for this purpose.

ROLE OF OUR LADY

This is her time and we must commend everything to her and her spouse, the Holy Spirit.

We wish, however, to start fundraising for particular parts of the project: in particular the Icon of Our Lady £25,000
