## Important class notices:

### EYFS Curriculum

Children follow a curriculum based on the Early Learning Goals which develop the children's skills and knowledge and prepares them for the more formal stages of learning in Key Stage 1.

The prime areas consist of Personal, Social and Emotional Development, Physical Development and Communication and Language. These areas are fundamental throughout the Early Years and are the key to a good start for all children. The prime areas begin to develop quickly in response to relationships and experiences. Once prime areas are developed, children are then able to learn through specific areas of Literacy, Mathematics, Understanding the World, and Expressive Arts and Design. Specific areas include essential skills and knowledge for children to participate successfully in society.

At Our Lady and St Anne's, we provide a learning environment which allows children to progress across all areas of the curriculum. Children have access to indoor and outdoor spaces and are able to learn according to their individual needs. Adults build strong relationships with the children and guide their learning through their play. Adult led activities are used alongside to teach skills when necessary using a range of individual, group and whole class teaching. As the children progress through the Early Years, more structure and adult led teaching will occur in order to prepare them for the transition into Year 1.

### Independence

We work very hard in Early Years to develop your child's independence and self-help skills. The children in Reception should be able to feed themselves, dress themselves including socks and shoes and be able to zip up their coats. They should also be able to use the toilet independently. Your child should also be able to recognise their own name and be able to write this independently.

Please practice these skills as much as possible at home if your child can not already do this.

### Homework

- Daily reading (10 minutes a day)
- Phonics – letter formation and sound work
- Watch episodes of Numberblocks and Alphablocks

# Transition information

<b>Our school day</b>
In Reception, children will enter through the gate between <b>8:40 - 8:50 am</b> and are to be collected at <b>3:05 pm</b> . Please ensure children arrive and are picked up promptly. If they have older siblings the children will leave at their siblings' collection time.
<b>Uniform policy</b>
Please ensure children are coming into school in their correct uniform especially on their PE days. The school uniform policy (including PE) can be found on the school website. It is also important in EYFS that children have spare clothing on their pegs. Also, please name everything, if items are not named we cannot take responsibility for things that go missing.
<b>Parent communication</b>
Tapestry is the main form of communication regarding your child's learning. We add observations of learning which can be shared at home and encourage parents to share observations of achievements at home e.g. new siblings, ballet classes, riding bike for the first time.  Please make sure you have access to Parent Hub AND Arbor as this our main means of communication with parents although we will be slowly moving all communication to Arbor. It is very easy to use and all parents must upload the app to any smart phone or device.
