IS 126 Cell Phone Policy 2025-2026

In alignment with the updated New York State guidance regarding the use of personal electronic devices in schools, The Albert Shanker School is committed to maintaining a focused, respectful, and distraction-free learning environment. The following cell phone policy is designed to support academic success and social interaction.

Policy Overview

1. Morning Check-In

- Upon entering the school building, students are required to place their cell phone inside a designated lockable pouch. Students will seal the pouch **in front of a staff member** at the designated entry point. Once sealed, students will **store the pouch in their backpack** for the remainder of the school day.

2. During the School Day

- Students are **not permitted to open, remove, or tamper with the pouch** during the school day. Cell phones, even if powered off, must always remain inside the pouch and in the student's backpack.

3. End of Day

- At dismissal, students may proceed to the designated unlocking station to remove their phone from the pouch.
- Students are expected to wait until they leave the building before using their devices. Students needing to leave early can open the pouch in the main office.

Emergencies

- In the event of an emergency, parents/guardians should call the school's main office 718-274-8316 to reach their child.
- Students who need to contact home during the school day may request to use a school phone through a staff member or administrator.
- We will utilize GAMA in order to communicate with parents/guardians in case of emergencies. Please contact our PC Lisa Mulero if you need assistance.

Consequences for Non-Compliance

Violations of this policy may result in the following actions:

- Warning and staff/administrator intervention
- Confiscation of the device or pouch for parent/guardian pickup
- Disciplinary action in accordance with the NYC Standards of Discipline

Our goal is to create a learning space free from digital distractions, where students are fully present and engaged. We appreciate the cooperation of students, families, and staff in implementing this policy with consistency and respect.
