1. General Statement of Intent

GreenTech Scotland recognizes that our operations have a direct impact on the local and global environment. As a leading provider of commercial electrical, fire safety, LED lighting, and renewable energy systems, we occupy a unique position: our core business activities actively facilitate the decarbonization of the Scottish commercial sector.

However, we acknowledge that to be a true Tier-1 partner, we must hold our own operations to the highest environmental standards. We are committed to minimizing our ecological footprint, preventing pollution, and continually improving our environmental performance in alignment with the ISO 14001 Environmental Management System framework.

2. Core Environmental Commitments

To fulfill our environmental responsibilities, GreenTech Scotland's Management Team commits to the following strategic objectives:

- **Statutory Compliance: To comply with (and where possible, exceed) all applicable Scottish and UK environmental legislation, including regulations enforced by the Scottish Environment Protection Agency (SEPA).**
- **Waste Management & The Circular Economy: To strictly adhere to the WEEE (Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment) Directive. We guarantee the ethical disposal and recycling of legacy fluorescent lighting, redundant switchgear, and end-of-life solar/battery components removed from client sites.**
- **Operational Decarbonization: To systematically measure and reduce our own Scope 1 and Scope 2 emissions. This includes the ongoing transition of**

the GreenTech commercial fleet to Electric Vehicles (EVs) and optimizing our engineer routing to minimize fuel consumption.

- **Sustainable Procurement:** To prioritize supply chain partners (such as our lighting and solar PV manufacturers) who demonstrate transparent ESG (Environmental, Social, and Governance) commitments and utilize sustainable packaging.
- **Pollution Prevention:** To implement strict site-level controls during installations to prevent the accidental release of hazardous substances, noise pollution, and localized environmental disruption.

3. Empowering Our Clients (The Net Zero 2045 Agenda)

Beyond our internal operations, GreenTech Scotland is dedicated to helping our commercial, educational, and industrial clients meet the Scottish Government's Net Zero 2045 mandate.

We achieve this by:

- **Designing and deploying high-yield Solar PV and Battery Energy Storage Systems (BESS) that generate clean, localized power.**
- **Value-engineering intelligent LED lighting upgrades to drastically reduce commercial base-load energy consumption.**
- **Providing transparent ROI and Carbon Reduction modeling to help clients secure green funding and achieve their Section 63 Action Plan requirements.**

4. Allocation of Responsibilities
