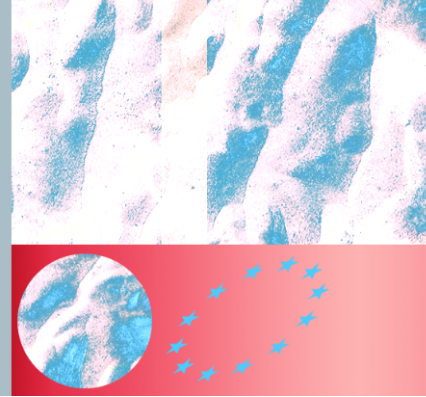


(I Love) → My City

Start with what God has already placed on your heart.

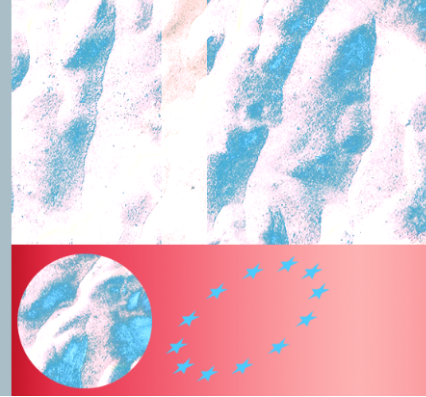
Ask your Team:

Examples

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- Encouraging hospital patients
- Supporting foster families
- Visiting seniors

3. Discover the Needs Around You

Take a few minutes to learn what needs exist near you. Many communities already have organizations doing great work that you can partner with.

Ways to find needs:

- Search local food banks or shelters
- Look for nonprofits serving specific groups (kids, seniors, veterans)
- Check local community centers, schools, or churches

Simple places to start

- Food pantries
- Homeless shelters
- Nursing homes
- Hospitals
- Foster care organizations

4. Pray and Share the Love of Jesus

Outreach isn't just about meeting needs, it's about showing people the love of Jesus.

Ways to do this:

- Ask people how you can pray for them
- Listen to someone's story
- Show kindness to everyone you serve

5. Stay Consistent
