



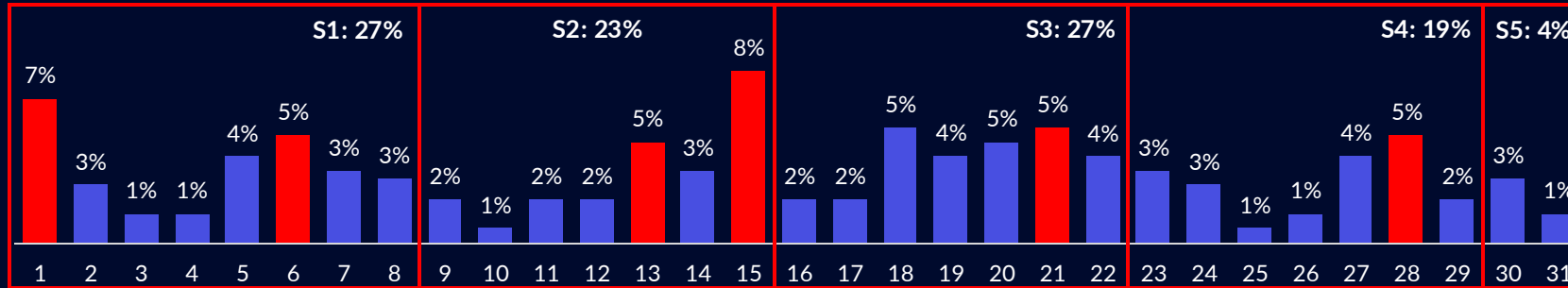

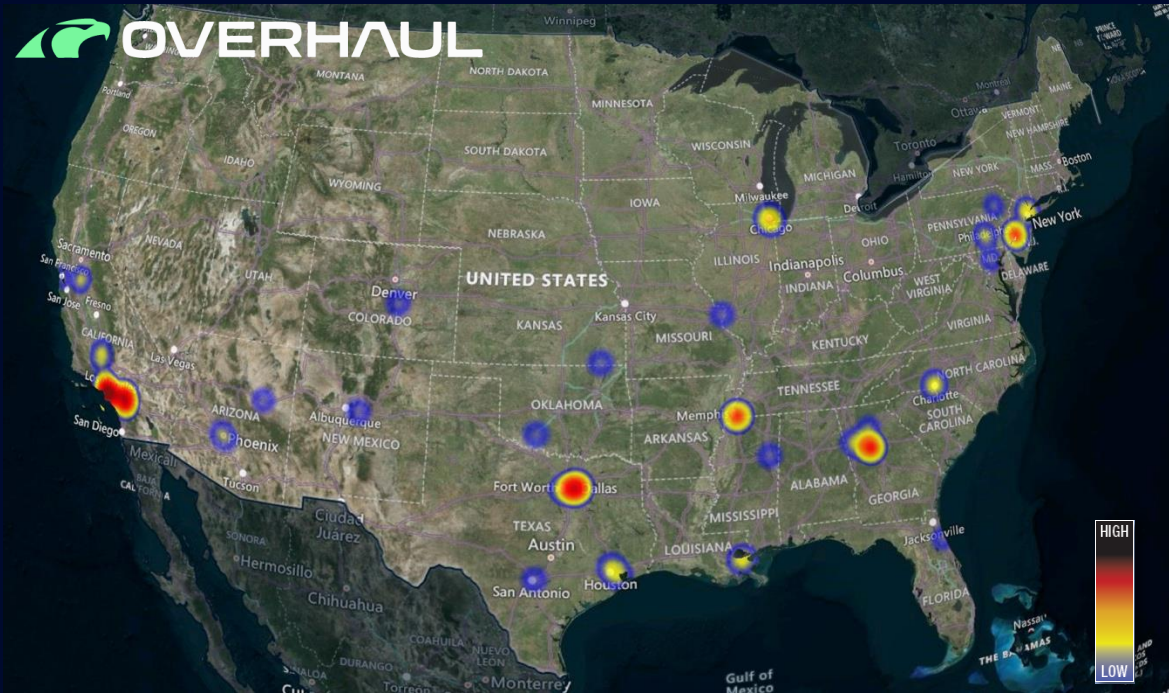

USA CARGO THEFT - MARCH 2025

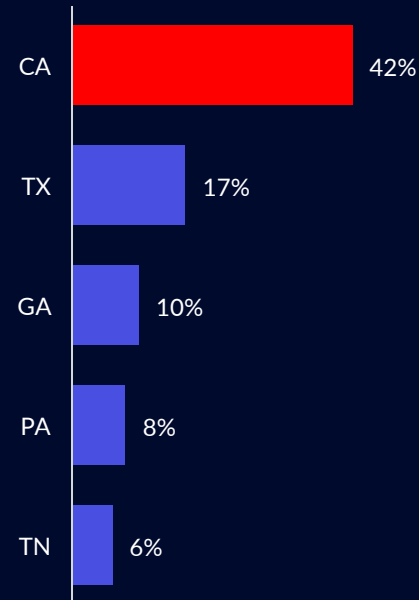
MONTHLY TREND BY DAY



In March 2025, the risk of cargo theft was evenly distributed throughout the month. However, there were notable peaks in theft reports during the first and second weeks. This aligns with historical trends, as March has consistently been a month marked by significant disruptions, typically seeing a sharp increase in cargo theft incidents. March 2025 was no exception to this pattern.



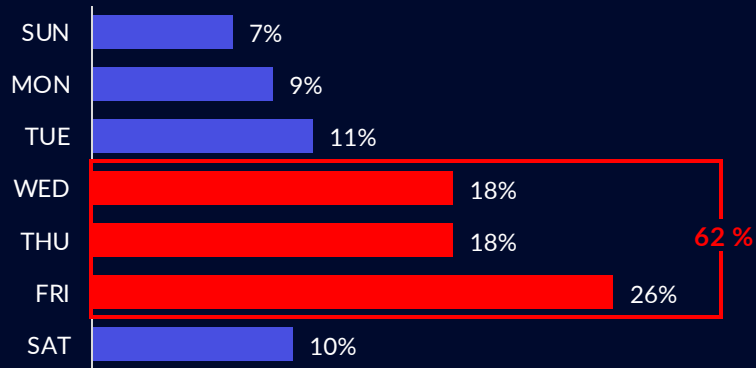
TOP 5 STATES



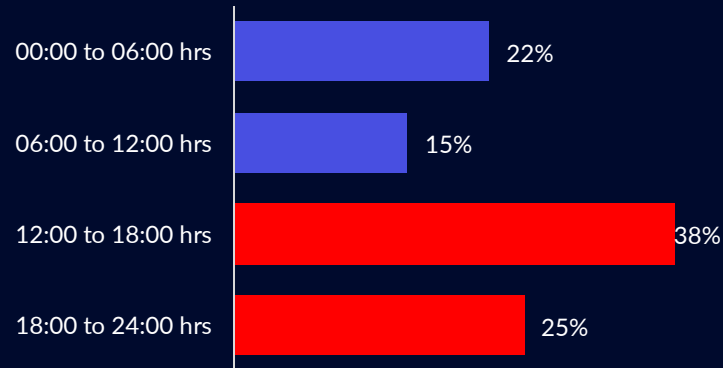
Spatially, California continued to lead the nation in cargo theft incidents, with Southern California (SoCal) identified as the primary hotspot. Following closely were the Fort Worth-Dallas area, Atlanta, Memphis, and Philadelphia, indicating a widespread geographical distribution of cargo theft risks across major commercial and logistical hubs in the United States.

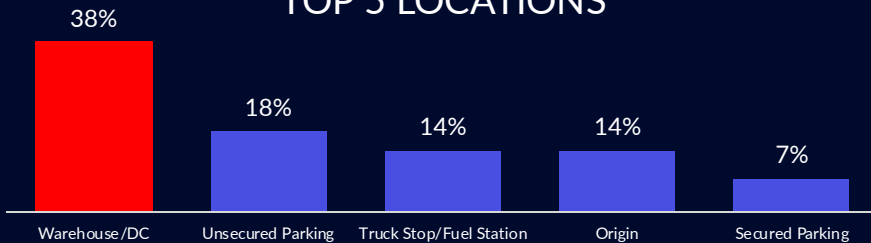
DAY OF THE WEEK



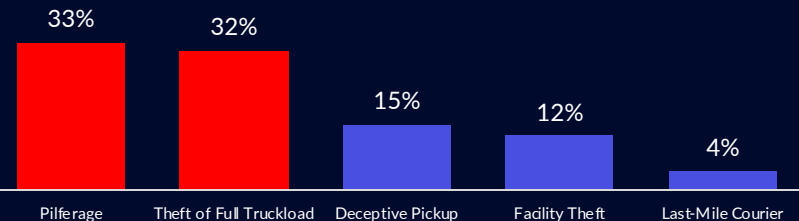
TIME OF DAY



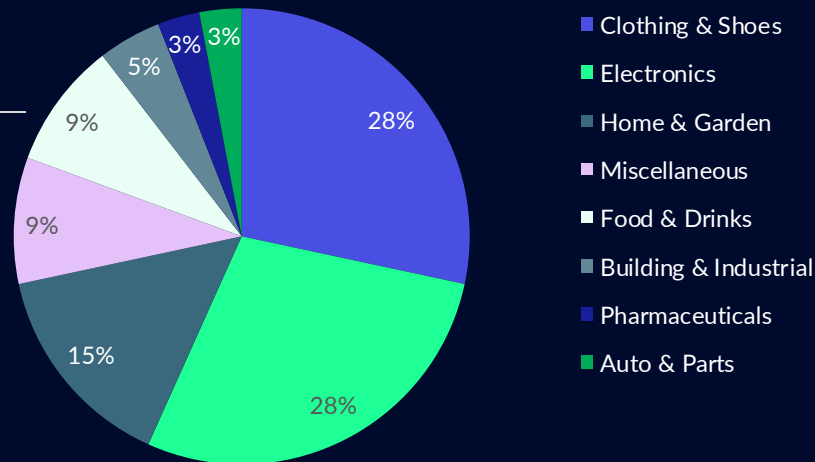
TOP 5 LOCATIONS

Regarding the temporal analysis, the last three days of the week showed the highest concentration of cargo theft, accounting for 62% of all incidents. Examining the timing of the thefts, 63% occurred between 12 PM and midnight, following the trend observed in February. Another consistent trend observed was in the types of events, as Pilferage and Theft of Full Truckloads continued to be the most frequent event types. A significant number of Deceptive Pickups were also recorded in March, growing 5 percentage points versus February.
