Highlight - Recovery Case

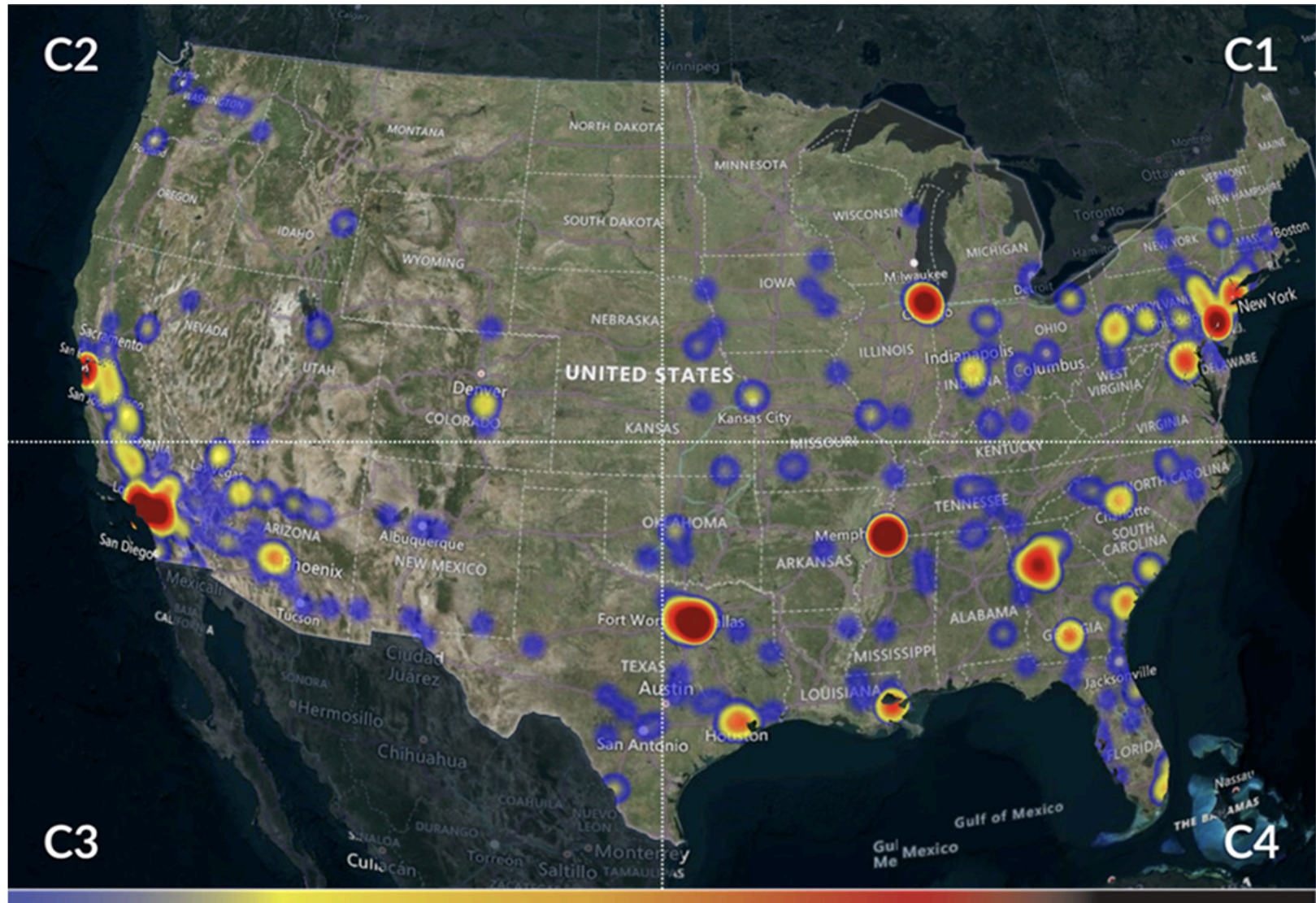
Southern California | Athletic Apparel | December 19, 2025

Overhaul's Global Security Operations Center (GSOC) was alerted to a potential threat involving a high-value shipment of athletic apparel valued at over \$200,000. The cargo, originally departed from Carson, CA and was bound for Ohio. It made a stop in Compton, CA. During this stop, both the tractor and trailer were stolen from a yard facility by unidentified thieves.

Upon discovering the unauthorized movement, the driver acted quickly, immediately notifying their chain of command.

Overhaul's LE Connect team immediately contacted local law enforcement and provided real-time intelligence regarding the shipment's location. Law enforcement officers were able to locate the trailer in Fontana. The trailer had been abandoned, and the tractor was no longer present at the scene. A preliminary assessment determined that the shipment itself appears to have been recovered intact.

This incident highlights the importance of rapid incident reporting and close collaboration between supply chain partners and law enforcement. Reviewing yard security protocols and establishing strong communication channels to effectively respond to future security threats. It is important to maintain a clear chain of escalation and thoroughly document all details for every driver, tractor, and trailer arriving to pick up cargo.

- States with the highest Theft Rates in which Dick's Sporting Goods:
- California accounts for 35% of cargo theft in the U.S. - 57 stores (7% of Dick's Sporting Goods in U.S.)
 - Texas accounts for 22% of cargo theft in the U.S. - 52 stores
 - Georgia accounts for 6% of cargo theft in the U.S. - 25 stores
 - Tennessee accounts for 14% of cargo theft in the U.S. - 17 stores

- What Overhaul provides to diminish this risk:
- 80% reduction in theft attempts
 - 99% recovery rate of stolen goods

Overhaul Intelligence:

- The logistics industry in the Midwest is experiencing a significant rise in fraudulent activities, with multiple groups using diverse tactics to steal high-value cargo. The theft ranges from straightforward stealing to complex schemes like false documentation and identity theft
