PHANG NGA AIRPORT 'NEEDED'

A meeting of the Joint Public and Private Sector Consultative Committee (JPPSCC) in the Andaman provinces of Krabi, Trang, Phang Nga, Phuket, Ranong and Satun was held recently to continue talks with Phuket Airport after the AoT decided to defer the project, reports the Bangkok Post.

Jaran Pandang, deputy director of Phuket Airport, said the AoT's policy, planning and budget committee decided to defer the plan to build Phang Nga airport because the AoT must abide by a Cabinet resolution from August 2022.

The Cabinet ordered the AoT to oversee the management of Udon Thani, Buri Ram and Krabi international airports and suspended the plan to build an airport in Phang Nga.

The AoT received an B11-million budget in November 2020 for a preliminary feasibility study for the airport

THAI TOURISM BOOST: 25.8 MILLION ASIAN TOURISTS EXPECTED IN 2024

In a bid to breathe fresh life into the Thai tourism sector in 2024, The Tourism Authority of Thailand (TAT) aims to attract an impressive tally of 25.8 million tourists. The focus is on visitors from geographically proximate Asia and South Pacific countries categorised as short-haul markets, shared Thanet Petchsuwan, TAT Deputy Governor. This quota forms a significant portion, 74% to be precise, of the bigger picture which is to welcome 35 million international globetrotters next year.

Thanet said...

"The revenue target we're looking at through this strategy is approximately 1.2 trillion baht, which is about 63% of the grand goal of pooling 1.92 trillion baht from foreign markets."

The specifics of the short-haul Thai tourism market goals encompass 12.48 million visitors from Eastern Asia, 10.51 million from ASEAN countries, 2.1 million from South Asia, and 787,000 from Oceania.

THAI TOURISM MINISTER PROPOSES BOLSTERING SECTOR FOR SUSTAINABLE TOURISM

To boost the national economy, Phiphat Ratchakitprakarn, Thailand's Tourism and Sports Minister, has put forth a proposal to prioritize tourism as a national agenda, with a focus on making Thailand a destination for sustainable tourism. He strongly encourages his successor to continue this endeavor.

Phiphat's aspirations don't end there, as he also suggested elevating the status of the tourism ministry, transforming it into a key economic establishment.

"Thailand doesn't have time to restart from zero. The tourism industry needs a drive from everybody to run faster and be able to compete with other countries."

Sanctioned by the National Tourism Policy Committee, the proposed plan presents both immediate and long-term strategies. It also calls for cross-agency collaboration involving multiple ministries and agencies, Bangkok Post reported.
