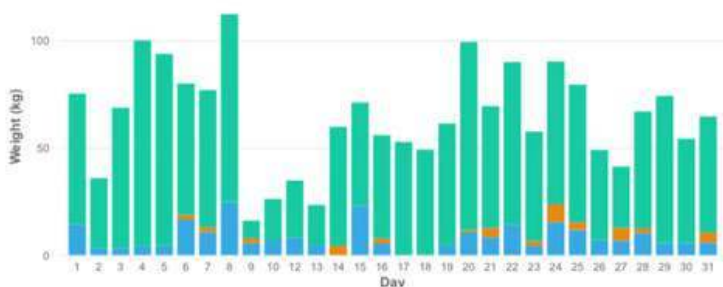

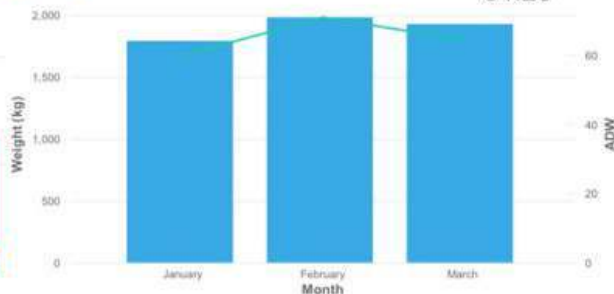

Modernizing Entry: Thailand Embraces a Paperless System with The Digital Arrival Card

As one of the world's most popular travel destinations, Thailand is revolutionizing its travel infrastructure to create a more seamless and efficient experience for visitors. A key innovation in this effort is the introduction of the digital arrival card system, marking a significant step toward modernizing Thailand's immigration process and aligning it with global trends in smart travel technology.

What is the Thailand Digital Arrival Card?

The Thailand Digital Arrival Card is the electronic version of the traditional disembarkation card that foreign visitors are required to complete upon arrival in Thailand. This card serves as an official record of the traveler's entry and provides essential information to immigration authorities.

This system, designed to replace the traditional paper-based arrival card, promises faster immigration processing, reduced paperwork, and improved border security.

GUIDELINES FOR THAILAND DIGITAL ARRIVAL CARD

Submit it **within 3 days** before arrival in Thailand

1 LOG IN TO THE PORTAL

2 COMPLETE REGISTRATION

Key Details Required
Personal Information: Full name, nationality, phone number, Email address and passport details
Trip Information: Flight number, purpose of travel, and address in Thailand (e.g., hotel or residential address)

3 SUBMISSION

After completing the form online, you will receive an acknowledgment email at the address provided during submission.

4 AT THE IMMIGRATION COUNTER

Present your acknowledgment email and travel documents to the immigration officer upon arrival for verification



Guidelines for Thailand Digital Arrival Card

Thai Immigration Bureau has introduced the use of Thailand Digital Arrival Card (TDAC) to facilitate travelers entering Thailand.

All Non-Thai nationals entering the Kingdom of Thailand, regardless of their mode of transportation including land, sea and air, must complete a TDAC online.

Don't forget to do TDAC before entering the Kingdom of Thailand

Compliance will be mandated from May 1st, 2025 onward.

SONGKRAN 2025 EXPECTED TO GENERATE OVER 130 BILLION BAHT

Thailand's Songkran 2025 festival is projected to generate 134.63 billion baht, up 4.5% from last year, reflecting strong public confidence and a rebound in tourism across the country. According to a University of the Thai Chamber of Commerce survey, 72.1% of Thais plan to travel—the highest rate since 2019—while only 5% intend to cut spending, the lowest in nine years. Despite a recent earthquake, 74.5% of respondents reported no change in spending habits. The government has reinforced safety inspections at hotels, tourist sites, and high-risk areas to maintain confidence and ensure preparedness. Businesses are reporting stable bookings and anticipate increased service usage during the holiday. Authorities are also coordinating with the tourism sector to ensure safety, strengthen communication with visitors, and promote a secure, enjoyable holiday.

CASINO BILL COULD LAND GOVT IN HOT WATER



Thirty former charter drafters have urged Parliament to withdraw the casino-entertainment complex bill, warning it could breach the constitution, national strategy, and ethical standards. In an open letter, they argued the bill lacks urgency, was never part of any party's campaign promises, and may violate sections related to the use of state assets and economic self-reliance. Concerns were raised about increased crime, gambling addiction, and vested interests, with no clear safeguards in place. They warned lawmakers that pushing the bill could result in lifetime political bans. Civil society and academics echoed the opposition, citing long-term social risks.

MASSAGE TRAINING EXPANDS TO MUSCLE CARE

Thailand's Ministry of Public Health is updating regulations to boost traditional Thai massage as a key health tourism asset and economic driver. Recognised by UNESCO as intangible cultural heritage, Thai massage contributes 190 billion baht annually to the national economy. A new training programme, launched by the ministry's Nuad Thai College, aims to train 20,000 practitioners in treating seven muscle-related conditions, enhancing both skills and income across the sector. Currently, only therapists in hospitals can charge for medical massages, but a regulation change will allow trained masseurs to do so legally. The move is set to raise professional standards, increase global competitiveness, attract more wellness travellers, and strengthen Thailand's wellness tourism credentials worldwide.

TARIFFS TO HIT TOURISM SENTIMENT



Thailand's ongoing stock market slump and concerns over US tariffs are dampening domestic tourism sentiment, especially for Songkran. Tour agencies report fewer local group bookings, as middle- and lower-income travelers cut back, while wealthier Thais opt for overseas trips. Though some families booked in advance, younger tourists are delaying or skipping travel plans altogether. Spending during trips is expected to be limited. The recent earthquake and economic uncertainty have also shaken travel confidence across regions. Pattaya hotels project 80–85% occupancy but see slower last-minute bookings. Officials stress the area is safe, outside of seismic risk zones, and buildings meet safety standards.

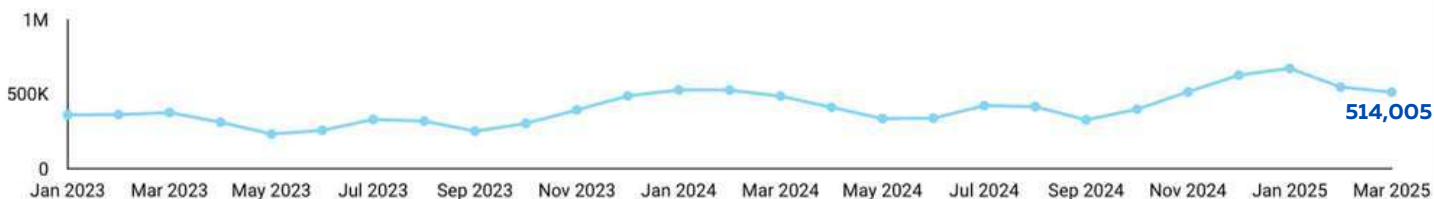
Phuket International Airport - in April
