What Working With Pink Nannies Feels Like

Travel support through Pink Nannies is designed to feel organized, steady, and well prepared. Whether your family is traveling for business, vacation, seasonal residence, or tour schedules, our goal is to maintain structure and consistency while your environment changes.

Our team manages the logistics so your focus remains on your child and your time together.

Beginning the Search

Week 1

You begin by completing our [contact form](#) and scheduling an initial call. Afterward, we share our service agreement for review. Once signed, you complete the Family Application and schedule a more detailed conversation to review travel dates, destination details, schedule expectations, accommodations, and responsibilities. During that call, we outline how the search will move forward.

Clarifying the Support

Week 1

We craft a detailed written job description based on your application and our conversations. You review and approve the job description. Once finalized, we post your position to our job board and begin outreach within our professional nanny network.

Meet Travel-Ready Nannies

Week 2

Your Placement Manager introduces you to candidates experienced in travel support whose background aligns with your itinerary and family style. Most families meet 1-3 candidates before making a decision.

We remain closely involved through interviews so expectations are clear before departure.

Moving Forward

Week 3 to 4

We coordinate interviews and, when appropriate, a structured working meeting prior to departure so you can experience communication style and interaction. Once you have chosen someone, we guide you through structuring the offer, coordinating background checks, confirming CPR certification, and preparing for the start date.

During the Assignment

Start Date + Ongoing

As your nanny begins, we remain available to support onboarding and communication. We stay connected with both your family and your nanny so expectations remain aligned throughout the assignment.

How Travel Nannies Are Selected

Candidates come to us through referrals, our involvement at national nanny conferences, local university networks, and the International Nanny Training Day events we host and sponsor across the United States, along with targeted outreach beyond our existing network.

Before you meet anyone, we have already interviewed them thoroughly, verified references and documented feedback, and reviewed their experience. Formal background screening takes place once a working interview or contingent offer stage is reached.

Responsibilities During Travel

A travel nanny provides consistent childcare while adapting to changing environments, schedules, and time zones. Expectations regarding hours, overnight presence, downtime, and accommodations are clarified before departure so the assignment remains structured and professional.

Compensation and Employment

Compensation varies based on experience, schedule, and responsibilities.

Typical ranges are:

\$40 to \$60+ per hour, with a minimum daily structure of 8 hours

Overnight and extended coverage are structured separately

Families are responsible for:

- Transportation to and from destinations
- Private accommodations
- Meals or a daily meal stipend

The travel professionals we represent have a minimum of three years of professional childcare experience, verified references, and current CPR certification. Many have previously traveled with families and understand how to maintain routines across flights, time zones, hotels, and seasonal residences. They are comfortable working in high-profile or privacy-sensitive environments and remain professional and discreet in public settings.

We generally recommend beginning the search six weeks before your departure date.
