Additional benefits, such as specialist 1-2-1 lessons may also be offered at our discretion. Further information on the process is available from our Admissions team.

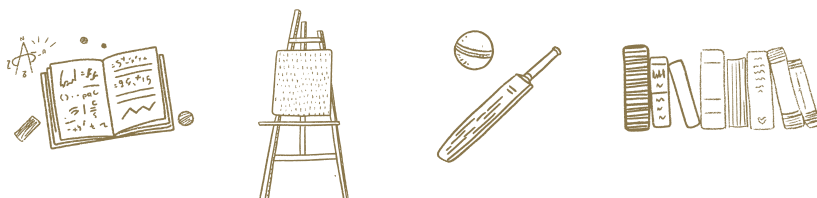
We welcome applications from existing Orwell Park pupils in Year 6 and from new pupils joining us in Year 7.

Academic

What do we look for?

We seek curious, passionate learners who explore ideas beyond the classroom through wide reading, independent research, creative projects, and a genuine love of discovery.

How do we assess?

Candidates sit written English and Maths papers, followed by interviews with the Head and Deputy Head (Academic). The assessment is designed to be a relaxed environment to showcase thinking skills and subject knowledge.

How do we help scholars?

We offer weekly academic scholarship sessions with tailored, challenge-led teaching, plus opportunities to take part in academic trips and competitions to extend learning beyond the classroom.

Scholarship through to senior schools

Academic scholars receive weekly group mentorship directly from the Deputy Head (Academic). These sessions encourage critical thinking on ethical issues and current affairs, the development of research and presentation skills, and provide guidance for interviews and targeted preparation for assessment papers in senior schools.

All-Rounder

Applicants must demonstrate strong academic potential alongside exceptional talent in at least two co-curricular areas.

What do we look for?

We seek curious, versatile pupils who excel across multiple disciplines—academically, creatively, or athletically. All-round applicants demonstrate leadership, enthusiasm, and a genuine passion for involving themselves fully in every aspect of school life.

How do we assess?

Candidates sit written English and Maths papers, followed by interviews with the Head and Deputy Head (Academic). Alongside this, applicants are assessed in their two chosen disciplines as outlined below.

How do we help scholars?

We offer weekly academic scholarship sessions with tailored, challenge-led teaching, plus opportunities to take part in academic trips and competitions. Alongside this, scholars will have dedicated support in their chosen disciplines, outlined further below.

Scholarship through to senior schools

All-round scholars receive weekly group mentorship directly from the Deputy Head (Academic). They will also receive tailored support and guidance for their two chosen disciplines.

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Art & Design

What do we look for?

We seek curious, creative applicants with a passion for experimentation, risk-taking, and exploring new techniques. Candidates demonstrate an interest in Art or Design & Technology beyond the classroom, through personal projects or gallery visits can discuss an inspiring artist or style, and are driven by a love of creating.

How do we assess?

Candidates present a selection of recent 2D or 3D work, sketchbooks, textiles, or photos (no mounting required). The day includes an observational pencil drawing, a short colour study, and brief interviews with the Head of Art or DT and the Head.

How do we help scholars?

Art Scholars receive weekly dedicated sessions, access to a studio workspace, and portfolio guidance. They can also attend optional Saturday sessions to further refine their creative talents.

Scholarship through to senior schools

Scholars receive tailored guidance in preparing a portfolio specifically for senior school applications, along with support in interview preparation.

Drama

What do we look for?

We seek passionate, collaborative pupils with strong dramatic potential, imagination, and a willingness to take creative risks. Prior experience is not required; we value commitment, adaptability to direction, and potential over polish.

How do we assess?

Candidates perform a short prepared monologue and participate in a practical workshop covering improvisation, and creative exercises exploring movement, voice, or devising. The day concludes with discussions with the Head of Drama and the Head to evaluate communication, creativity, and attitude.

How do we help scholars?

Drama Scholars follow a supportive and challenging programme that develops confidence, creativity, and performance skills. Pupils benefit from dedicated scholar sessions, optional extra drama lessons, enrichment opportunities such as theatre visits and workshops, and regular performance opportunities. Individual or small-group LAMDA lessons and preparation for LAMDA examinations further support each pupil's development.

Scholarship through to senior schools

Pupils build confidence through regular performance practice, text work, audition technique, and interview preparation, supported by mock scholarship workshops and individual guidance. This ensures they approach assessments with confidence, skill, and a strong creative voice.

Music

What do we look for?

We seek musical potential, curiosity, and natural musical instinct. Candidates usually work at Grade 4 standard or above, demonstrating a love of music, commitment to their instrument or voice, and a eagerness to perform and learn from feedback.

How do we assess?

The assessment includes a short performance, simple aural activities, a brief musical discussion, and, where appropriate, a short sight-reading or quick-learning task, along with an informal conversation about musical interests and experiences with the Director of Music. This is followed by a meeting with the Head.

How do we help scholars?

Music Scholars follow an inspiring programme with weekly lessons, daily practice room access, and regular performance opportunities. They receive expert guidance in practice, repertoire, theory, and composition within a supportive musical community.

Scholarship through to senior schools

We offer tailored preparation to develop repertoire, performance, aural skills, sight-reading, and musical literacy. Mock auditions build confidence, ensuring pupils leave Year 8 prepared and excited for their next steps.

Sport

What do we look for?

We look for pupils with strong athletic potential, a positive attitude, and a clear commitment to sport. This includes good coordination, balance, speed, agility, and age-appropriate sport-specific skills. We value coachable pupils who respond well to feedback, show resilience, work effectively in teams, and demonstrate enthusiasm for training, competition, and representing the school.

How do we assess?

Pupils will be given an introduction to OPS Sport, a fitness test and some sport-specific exercises, followed by an informal chat with the Head of Sports Development. This is followed by a meeting with the Head.

How do we help scholars?

Sports Scholars receive a structured programme with access to high-quality coaching and specialist support. Individual development plans are reviewed regularly, alongside opportunities to represent and lead the school teams in fixtures, festivals, and tours.

Scholarship through to senior schools

Pupils will experience scholarship-style assessments, learn how to train and reflect effectively, and understand expectations at senior schools. Support is provided with applications and references, alongside opportunities to build leadership, confidence, and sport-specific knowledge.
