
THIS WEEKS REFLECTION FROM FR JONATHON

Like last Sunday's Scriptures, today's readings proclaim that while salvation always comes from God, God does expect and await human response. Imagine – the Almighty chooses to save and re-create humankind only with our cooperation! While Isaiah paints a portrait of humanity perfected "that day" of God's final salvation, Matthew underscores the human role in bringing about a world ruled by divine values and power.

By describing the work of God's Messiah, the one through whom God was expected to bring a new age of salvation, Isaiah sketches an outline of the divine vision. The awaited Messiah will be king of the line of David ("a shoot ... of Jesse", David's father) who will perceive, judge and act in "the spirit of the Lord." In the Bible, divine "spirit" describes the powerful presence of God within a person or community, imparting strength to carry out God's wishes and commands.

As king, a Messiah acting in God's spirit will create a new human community of justice. This biblical term points to a state of right relationships: when justice reigns, human beings live in right relationships to the God who always saves, to all members of the human community, and to the material world. Under the rule of God's vision of justice, artificially created boundaries dissolve, all people work together to meet the needs of all, and the physical world itself functions as a peaceful unity.

In the Gospel, John the Baptist announces that this new world is at hand in Jesus, who fulfils Isaiah's prophecy. The expected one bearing God's Spirit is already present in the person of Jesus, and he will share that Spirit with those who respond with repentance.

Therefore, you are invited to bring along your baby Jesus figure from your crib at home (or the whole crib if baby Jesus is not detachable) to be blessed on the Third Sunday of Advent.

It is particularly appropriate to do this during Advent, especially the final part, as we look with longing and anticipation to Christ's coming in glory.

CHRISTMAS CANDLES FOR OUR LOVED ONES

This year we would like to invite parishioners to burn a candle in memory of loved ones. These red Sanctuary Candles will burn continuously around our Crib through the Octave of Christmas for loved ones. If you would like a candle, please pick up an envelope from the back of the Church. The cost of the candles are £7.50 or 2 for £12.00. The closing date is 20th December. Please put your envelopes in the offertory basket when it comes around on Sunday.

A GENTLE REMINDER

Please remember to switch off your mobile phone (or put it on silent) when coming into Church, and please do not eat or drink while in Church. This is a way we show reverence to Jesus present in the Tabernacle. When we receive Jesus in Holy Communion can we please remember '**Jesus gives himself to me. I eat Him where the priest can see. And if I want the cross to make, I eat Him first for safety's sake. If it's for Jesus that I long, why not receive Him on my tongue? Flat hand or tongue the choice I make, I never just reach out and take!**'


CONNECT (Newcastle): 20-40 YEAR OLD?
