### Year 3 and 4 Forest School

Our Year 3 and 4 pupils continue to take part in Forest School sessions each week. These sessions encourage teamwork, problem-solving, and a love of nature while helping children develop confidence and resilience. Please ensure your child has suitable clothing for outdoor activities, including waterproofs, warm layers, and wellies. We do have a small selection of waterproof clothing in school, but we encourage pupils to bring their own if possible. These sessions will continue whatever the weather, so being prepared helps ensure the children can make the most of the experience.

### Lego League Grant

We are delighted to announce that our school has successfully secured a grant to establish the *Lego League* programme. This initiative introduces children to robotics, engineering, and coding through hands-on, creative activities using Lego. This week, pupils in Year 4 and Year 6 took part in their first Lego sessions, learning how to design and build using technology to solve real-world problems. We are excited to see this programme inspire teamwork, curiosity and innovation across our school.

### Parent Feedback

In December, we will be inviting parents to share their thoughts through a school-wide feedback survey. This will be an opportunity for you to tell us what you feel is working well and to suggest any areas for improvement. Your views are extremely valuable to us and help shape how we continue to develop and improve the learning experiences and environment we provide for all our pupils.

### Anti-Bullying Week – Starting 10th November

Next week marks Anti-Bullying Week, a national initiative that focuses on promoting kindness, respect, and inclusion. Throughout the week, children will take part in lessons and activities that explore positive relationships, different types of bullying, and strategies for preventing and responding to unkind behaviour.

The theme this year encourages everyone to make a difference by speaking up and showing kindness in everyday actions.

To launch the week and celebrate individuality, we will be holding an *Odd Socks Day* on Monday 10th November. All children are invited to wear odd socks alongside their school uniform to remind us that it is our differences that make us special.

### Remembrance Day – 9th November

As we approach Remembrance Day on Sunday 9th November, we will be taking time as a school to remember our own loved ones who have died. This year, we will have a *Book of Remembrance* displayed in our school entrance area. We will be sending home remembrance slips. If you would like to write an entry for the book, please return the completed slip to your child's teacher as soon as possible. Families are welcome to complete more than one slip, and you may choose to write a prayer, poem, comment, or even include a drawing. The Book of Remembrance will remain on display throughout the month of November.
