The IB career path is similar to that of alumni with a Swiss Maturity Diploma, for those students who obtain 32 points or more in the IB Diploma. For the others, their choices are most frequently; Art schools, the Hospitality Business Industry, Business and Management, Marketing, International Relations (EHL Hospitality Business School, Glion, Vatel, BSL, SAWI, IFM, Webster, etc.), for those who obtain IB 'certificates' other possibilities are considered. Finally, for both diplomas, the tendency to take a sabbatical year is increasing.
