Edward (Ed) Eastaugh is an archaeologist and Anthropology lab manager at Western University with over 30 years of experience in archaeological fieldwork and geophysical survey. His expertise includes mapping Paleo-Inuit sites, conducting remote sensing surveys of historic cemeteries, and using geophysical methods to locate unmarked graves. He currently works with First Nation communities searching for missing children at former Indian residential schools and helped found the Canadian Archaeological Association's Working Group on Unmarked Graves.



Sarah Hazell is a Nishnaabe Kwe Ndaaw archaeologist and anthropologist from Nipissing First Nation with over 25 years of experience working in Canada and internationally. A Ph.D. candidate at the University of Toronto, she specializes in community-based research and capacity building with Indigenous communities in northern Ontario. She is a member of the Canadian Archaeological Association's Working Group on Unmarked Graves, whose work received the Governor General's Innovation Award, and has also been recognized with a Lieutenant Governor's Heritage Award for the Pathways to Reclamation project.
