What We Will Talk About

- Why a trespass by-law is being considered and what issues it may address.
- How the by-law can support community safety, privacy, land protection, and respectful conduct.
- What expectations should apply to visitors, contractors, non-members, and restricted areas.
- How enforcement, education, warnings, and consequences should be handled fairly.
- How Sagamok Anishnawbek values and community voices should guide the final by-law.

Discussion Questions

1. What trespass concerns are most important for Sagamok Anishnawbek to address?

2. Are there areas, events, facilities, or lands that need clearer access rules?
3. What should visitors and non-members understand before entering Sagamok lands?
4. What kind of education, signage, or communication would help people follow the by-law?
5. What would a fair and respectful enforcement process look like?
