STARSaver ACCOUNT

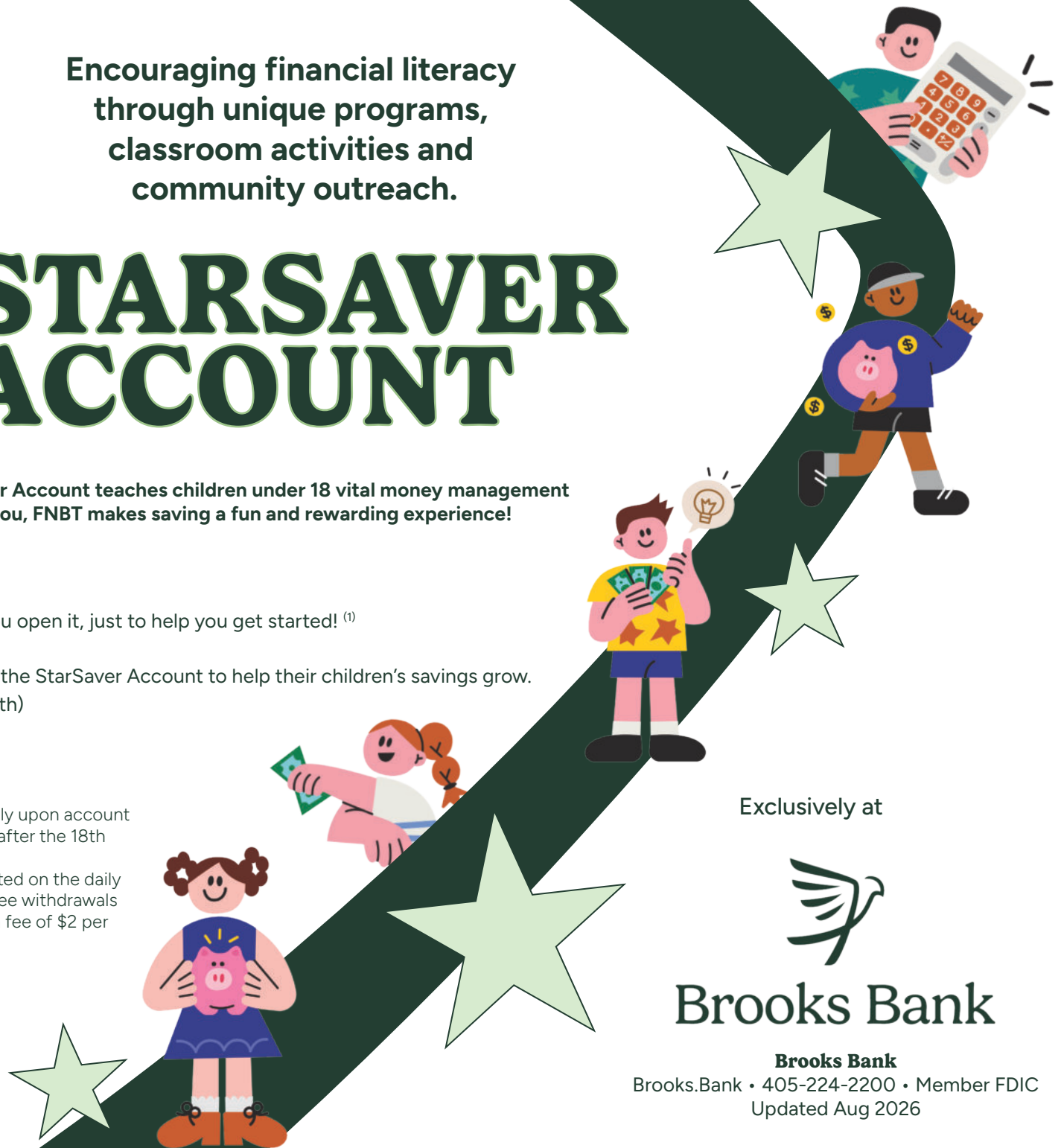

(2) This is a variable rate account. Interest is calculated on the daily balance, credited and compounded quarterly. Six free withdrawals are allowed per quarter. After six free withdrawals, a fee of \$2 per withdrawal is required. Ask for current rates.
