Governor DeSantis' Budget Proposal Prioritizes Law Enforcement

Governor Ron DeSantis has released his proposed budget for the upcoming fiscal year, showcasing a strong commitment to Florida's law enforcement community. **The \$115.6 billion budget** plan includes significant pay increases for state law enforcement officers.

Key Budget Allocations

- **\$23 million** allocated to continue the successful **Law Enforcement Recruitment Bonus Program**.
- This initiative offers **signing bonuses of up to \$5,000** for first-time law enforcement officers in Florida.
- Funding will benefit various state and local agencies, strengthening Florida's law enforcement workforce.
