**Signed, Sealed, Gwinnett: The signature that shaped a community**

As our nation celebrates the 250th anniversary of the Declaration of Independence, Americans across the country are reflecting on the individuals whose courage helped launch an unprecedented experiment in self-government. Here in Gwinnett County, we have a unique connection to that story.

Our community bears the name of Button Gwinnett, one of the 56 signers of the Declaration of Independence. Yet despite seeing his name every day on our schools, businesses, roads, and public buildings, many know little about the man behind it.

Button Gwinnett was not born a statesman. He was an entrepreneur, a risk-taker, and, like many business leaders today, someone who experienced both success and failure. He left England in search of opportunity, built businesses, pursued public service, and ultimately found himself at the center of one of the most consequential moments in human history.

When Gwinnett signed the Declaration of Independence in 1776, there was no guarantee of success. The colonies were challenging the most powerful empire in the world, and failure could have cost him everything. Yet he chose to act anyway. I often wonder what Button Gwinnett would think if he could see the county that bears his name today. As we commemorate the 250th anniversary of our nation's founding, let us remember that the Declaration of Independence was more than a document. It was a commitment to possibility.
