Learning Objective

Learning Outcomes

1 To work together as a team to complete a set task

Children can:

- Use a step-by-step approach to solve problems

2 To read a map and understand the key symbols

Children can:

- Read a map and understand the key and the symbols on it
- Work as a team to complete an orienteering course

3 To orientate a map and find control points by using their surroundings

Children can:

- Read and follow a range of simple maps and support others in their map reading, such as using a key
- Orientate a map and find key landmarks from their surroundings
- Know the meaning of a range of common map symbols, including some additional symbols not featured in the lesson's resources

4 To use control cards and punch markers

Children can:

- Know how to use a punch marker and cards
- Find control points in a set course around the school

5 To set up and complete an orienteering course challenge for their classmates

Children can:

- Produce an orienteering map with accuracy with 8 – 10 control points
- Accurately mark locations on a map for other pupils to follow
- Work with others to put on an orienteering activity for a specified group of children
- Work with others to complete an orienteering course

6 To complete an orienteering course with a partner set up by their peers

Children can:

- Complete a 16-station orienteering course
- Understand how to read a map, and follow a set

On Target

- Solve problems individually and as a team

Above Target

- Take the lead in tasks, and support their peers with the objectives
- Follow a map into an unknown location
- Use clues and a compass to navigate a route
- Take part in outdoor and adventurous activity challenges both individually and in a team
- Be able to move the map so the layout of the features on the map matches those around them

Excelling

- Competes/demonstrates an ability to compete at an elite level
- Can analyse skills and techniques to modify and improve performance
- Use a map and find the eight different directions on a compass (N, NE, E, SE, S, SW, W, NW)

To achieve **EXCELLING**, pupils must achieve all bullet points from **WORKING TOWARDS**, **ON TARGET** and **ABOVE TARGET** as well as at least 3 bullet points from **EXCELLING**.
