What do we know about Cricket?

Cricket dates back to the 1500s and evolved into England's national summer sport by the 18th century. It spread through the British Empire to Asia, the Caribbean and Oceania, creating a global community of nations now linked by the International Cricket Council (ICC). Cricket developed from long Test matches to One-Day and T20 formats, emphasising strategy, patience and teamwork. Elite players use data analysis to study strike rates, ball trajectories and field efficiency. The sport instils discipline, respect and resilience while building national identity and pride.
