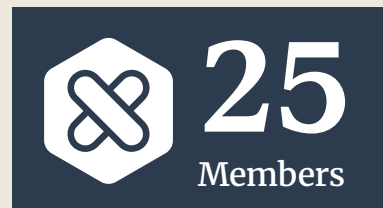

As we close out 2025, we are deeply grateful for God's faithfulness as we celebrate four years of Coastal Church Chesapeake. This year was marked by powerful moments of life change, growth, and gospel impact. We celebrated seven baptisms, each representing a transformed life through Jesus. One story captures the heart of our mission: a father who attended our Christmas Eve service in 2024 gave his life to

Christ, was baptized on Easter this year, and in 2025 had the joy of baptizing his own son after his son surrendered his life to Jesus.

Our Sunday gatherings have increased by 23% this year. Both Coastal Kids and Student ministries have seen an increase as well. We saw our largest Christmas Eve with 422 people coming and several committing their lives to Jesus. Coastal Chesapeake's impact reaches beyond our campus. Members participated in mission trips to Honduras and Poland, and we led our first campus mission trip to Kenya, partnering with Project Lucas (a gospel-centered ministry and school). Seventeen members served by setting up a computer lab, training teachers in Gospel-Centered Life discipleship tool, and we

were able to share the Gospel with over 1,000 students across schools in the region.

Locally, our ECHO Foster Family Coat Drive exceeded expectations. With an initial goal of 80 coats, the church collected 144 coats, blessing foster families and supporting a local missionary serving through Apartment Life. Most inspiring, 75% of our church family actively serves in ministry, reflecting a shared commitment to developing authentic followers of Jesus Christ. As we enter year five, we look ahead with faith and expectation—the best is yet to come.

God blessed our year at Hampton as we solidified our ministry and prepared for what He has in store for next year. We have had some staffing changes throughout the year. Timothy Martin began as a pastoral resident at Hampton in August and Leslie Youtsey took on the position of Coastal

Kids Coordinator in September. We also had a new volunteer Student Ministry Coordinator restart our Student Ministry in September. We are excited to see the progress already being made in these areas. Our attendance has moved to an average of 150 throughout the fall months, and small group attendance has grown as well. We have enjoyed the privilege of seeing 6 people baptized in 2025, and we have several more preparing to pursue this step in the spring. Building renovations have been significant in 2025: New, expanded entrance, additional security for children's space, stage completely renovated,

new permanent sound installation, new high-efficiency windows installed in the auditorium, new roof and gutters, plans are underway to address our parking lot. The biggest change at Hampton in 2025 was a change in leadership. On December 7, Pastor Tito Tirado was installed as the Lead Pastor in Hampton. On that Sunday, we had our highest attendance ever with 242. On the 14th, the Hampton family sent out the Wilsons to our next assignment as Associate Pastor in Gloucester. We are excited about what God is doing in Hampton and look forward to what He has in store for 2026!

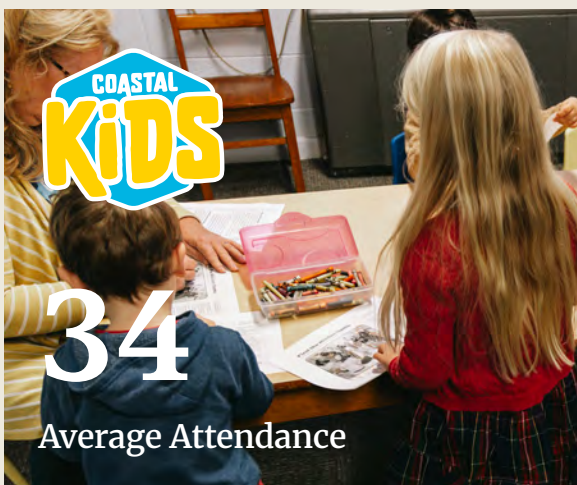

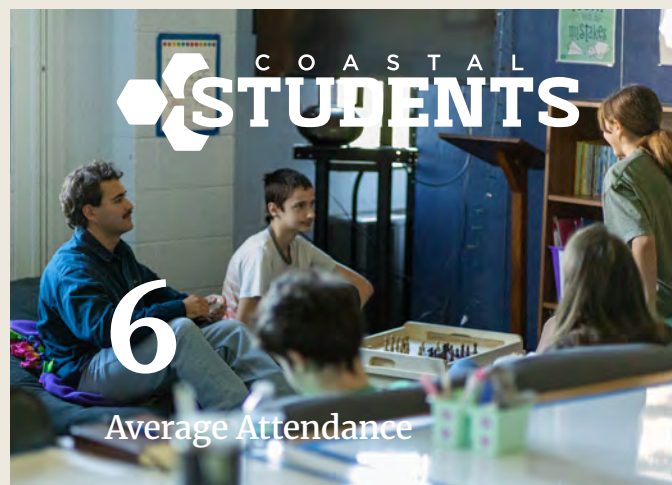

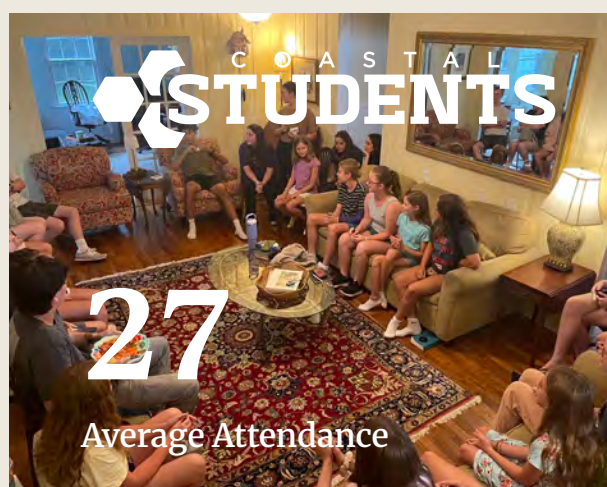
for the name and fame of Jesus Christ. Church family, thank you for all that you do in the service of that name!

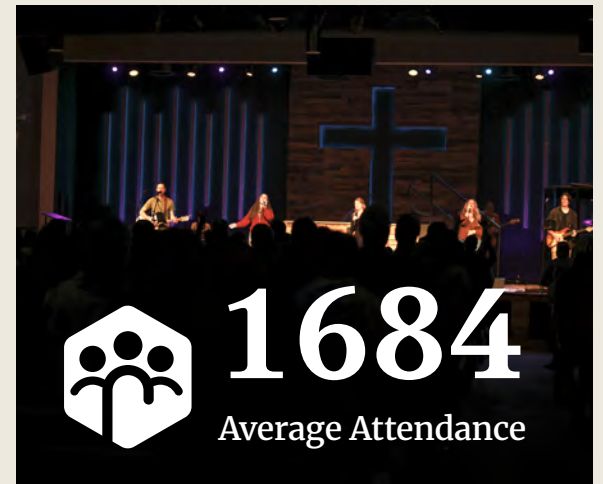
God blessed Coastal Yorktown beyond telling in 2025. Our weekly worship services have continued to grow at a steady rate, culminating in a Christmas Eve attendance of over 2,500 souls. And with the steady growth, God has provided a steady influx of new members willing and faithful to serve across every area of ministry. For instance, on any given Sunday at

Yorktown we minister the gospel to about 400 Coastal kids through the faithful work of well over 100 volunteers and leaders - a ratio of better than one volunteer for every four children.

Our off-campus ministry and missions have also continued to grow and accelerate as we've delivered the gospel locally and to the ends of the earth through several devoted and well-prepared mission teams. In addition to sustained support of in-house and local mission projects, like our monthly food and rescue mission ministries, our people have taken the gospel this year to many countries in Europe, Asia, Africa, South and Central America.

And back on the home front, we held several successful We Are Coastal events and a large

percentage of those who came chose to complete our membership process join our fellowship and become authentic followers of Jesus Christ. We've added several new deacons and elders to help lead and shepherd the work of the ministry across every area of our campus life. In October we hosted a 3-day all Coastal Leadership Retreat for more than 75 leaders and staffers for vision casting, meals together, critical workshops, and even some campus fun. And finally, our Yorktown based Shared Services groups provided countless critical operations and ministry support activities across all of our campuses, including major facility renovation at our newest site in Mathews! To God be the glory, great things He has done!



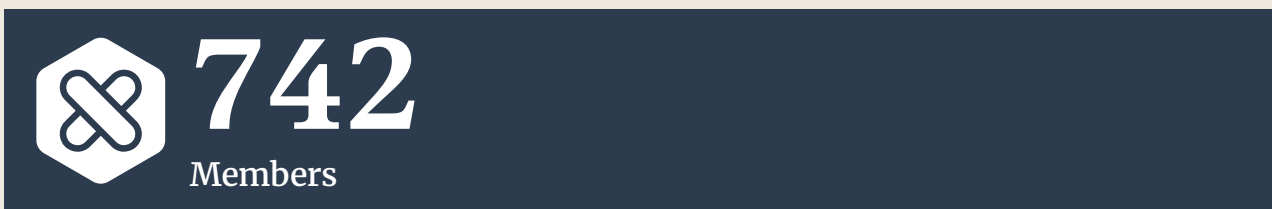

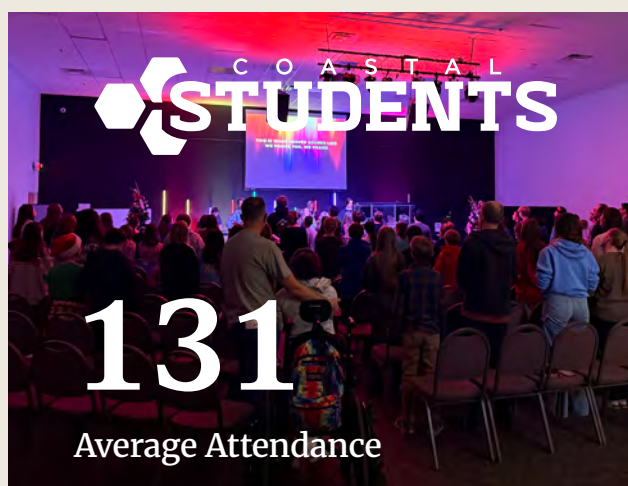
