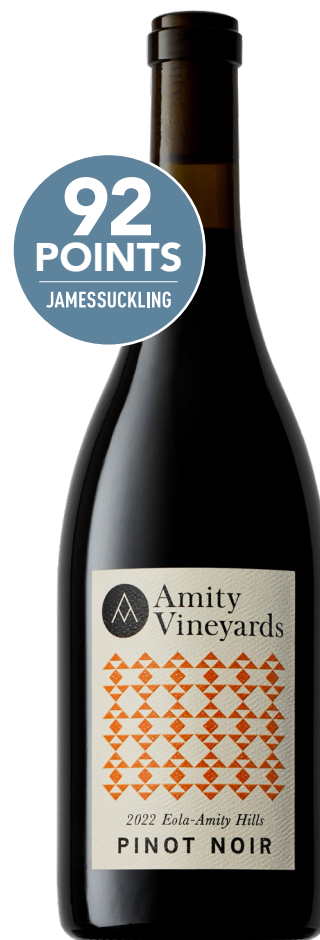
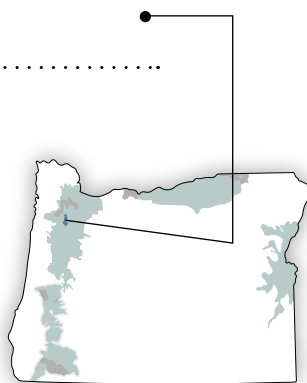

HERITAGE WINE. MODERN CONTEXT.

Amity Vineyards, one of the first pioneering Oregon wineries, was founded in 1974 by winemaker Myron Redford, who moved to Oregon with a dream to make world class Pinot Noir. He became known for his attention to detail and experimentation in the winemaking process, and as a result he was the first to produce organically grown sulfite-free wines. The first vineyards were planted in 1971, with a total of 15 acres planted in Pinot Noir, Riesling and Pinot Blanc.

The 2022 Growing Season was characterized by very wet weather late into the spring, a three week-later-than-average bud break, two mid-April frost events, the first more severe than the second, all followed by humidity throughout the summer leading

to mildew pressure unlike anything seen by the industry in recent memory. To add insult to injury, the Rogue Valley in Southern Oregon also saw July hail storms. There were, however, not one but two pieces of extreme good fortune that ultimately lead to outstanding quality in the 2022 vintage: a high fruit set and good fruitfulness in many secondary buds made up for losses to frost for many if not most vineyards, and autumn rains by and large stayed away until late October, a happy shock to growers and winemakers who spent the harvest season looking over their shoulders expecting the clouds to open at any moment. By the time the true Oregon rains finally came, the vast majority of winegrapes were harvested, with most fruit coming into wineries 2-3 weeks later than in most recent vintages.
