Every therapy journey is worth celebrating. We want to recognize the hard work, determination, and progress of the residents and patients we serve.



When Steve first arrived at Ohio Valley Manor, he was unable to walk. Through determination, dedication, and the support of our therapy team. He was able to return home walking with a cane and a renewed sense of independence!



Peggy H. admitted to our SNF from the hospital, after an acute episode that happened at home. She was unable to walk or transfer without assistance when she arrived to our SNF at Cottingham. She also could not do any activities of daily living.

After hard work with our therapy team, she has grown stronger and is now able to transfer herself and do many of her ADL's with minimal assistance. Because of her progress, she was able to move from the SNF to her own apartment in assisted living.



Carolyn P. admitted to us in back in April, after bouncing around other Skilled Nursing facilities post-surgery in November. When she arrived, she required moderate assistance with bed mobility, maximal assistance to stand up to a walker, and was dependent for completion of ADLs.

Over the last two months she has improved markedly because of the work she put in with Physical and Occupational therapies. Carolyn is now able to get herself in and out of bed as she pleases, walks with supervision up to 200 ft using a walker, takes herself to the bathroom, and dresses herself.





Sherry (Jackson)

Sherry M, is one of our very own staff members. Recently she had a health problem that caused her to be admitted into the facility for therapy. She is doing well and almost back to her old self.

We are so happy that she chose us and trusted her team members.

William (Hawthorn Glen)

Mr. William T moved into our AL facility last month and hes thriving. He came to us on our SNF, not able to move his legs/feet, and is now walking in therapy and is able to transfer himself and uses his wheelchair to get around. He is proof that hard work and determination pay off!



Omar (Convallarium)

"My experience at the Convallarium was nothing more than great! The Staff was incredible, from the RTs to the Social Workers.. I was told by the Pulmonologist that I would have a trach for the rest of my life. He also said if i was to get decannulated I would die!

The Director of Respiratory proved that theory wrong.. She worked hard for me to get decannulated. I am alive and better than ever! The nurses, physical therapists, and respiratory therapists nursed me back to life! Without the help of them, I would be dead and gone. I am definitely going to miss them a lot!

their dedication is seen, valued, and appreciated. This July, OVM is taking that appreciation a step further with the introduction of Nocturnal Nursing Week.

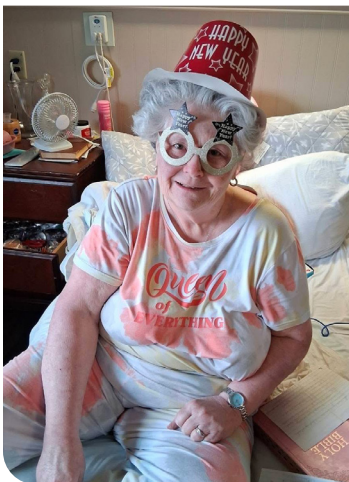

OVM Welcomes Project Life Students for Hands-On Learning Experience Ohio Valley Manor recently had the privilege of taking part in Project Life, an incredible program through Southern Hills Joint Vocational School. Project Life serves graduated students ages 18 to 25 who benefit from continued job training, hands-on learning, and real workplace experiences. For 12 weeks, one instructor and three Project Life students joined our team to learn more about what it is like to work in a healthcare facility. During their time at OVM, the students worked alongside members of our dietary department and

activities staff, gaining practical experience while also becoming a special part of our facility community.

The students were able to see firsthand how many different roles come together to support residents each day. From helping in dietary services to participating in activities, they had the opportunity to build skills, practice workplace routines, and interact with both staff and residents in a meaningful way.

OVM is a teaching facility. We team up with the local career and technical school for local high school students. Last year the OVM therapy department had two students who assisted in the clinic.
