When and how to call Medcor

- The supervisor should call with the employee after any injury occurs (more than a bandage – less than 911).
- If an interpreter is needed, advise the nurse when calling.
- Once the nurse has identified your company and location, they will ask for the employee to be put on the phone.
- The employee will describe the injury.
- Medcor's proprietary software evaluates the employee's injury using patented medical algorithms.
- Based on the system recommendation, the nurse will advise the employee on suggested next steps.
- If the employee is electing to self treat, the nurse will review in detail the self treatment plan.
- If the employee is going to the provider, Medcor will fax a Provider Injury Alert to the provider as long as we have been given a fax number already in our system.
