Built, Building, & Buildings

2025, going into 2026, has been a great time of building and expanding the ministry.

Let's review 2025:

- A deep well was drilled
- Solar water pump & 10,000 liter tank added
- Kitchen sink, water faucet, and updated firewood stove
- 5 faucets added around compound and orchard planting areas
- Hass avocado trees planted
- A house was started for Simon, Juru, and little Blessing
- Simon graduated high school and came home to work while we wait for his results

Since the beginning of 2026:

- A new double latrine and shower house was added in orchard area near new houses
- Simon & Juru's home roof was finished in February
- A building with 2 apartments for workers and their families started



Simon started working as farm manager in January. Already, he has been great at doing his job, so I can concentrate on the administration of the ministry and community outreach programs.

Our worker Moses brought his wife, Rose, and their 14-month-old son, Brian, from the camp. They fit right in. As soon as we finish building the apartments, another worker's wife and child will join us.

We now have 8 WoH kids in high school and 2 in primary school. They are all doing very well. We are currently paying for a total of 19 students. It costs about \$6,000 for school fees and requirements.

The first beekeeping training for 25 women was last year, and the second of the series of 4 was in January. Lots of knowledge shared along with Kingdom principles!

Last year, we supported Idiwa Church in the camp with Bibles, seeds, feeding of the elderly, and some medical assistance. It was a joy and an adventure to help David and Brandon (sent by their church in Wilmore, KY) travel to the Idiwa Church in Northern Uganda for an outreach program. Pastor Victor said the time was anointed and precious.

I have been a part of the Idiwa Church since we anointed the first poles in the ground 7 years ago. I hadn't hugged, prayed, and worshipped with them for 3 years. It was a spiritually refreshing and joyful time. There have been countless others that we have helped along the way. Just a few weeks ago, I was staying in Gulu, and a visitor had a sick 12-year-old boy I felt was misdiagnosed. I sponsored them to go get lab work on his kidneys. It was abnormal, so they went to the hospital. I followed up, and he is doing better but is still hospitalized.

Five kids are going from primary to high school on March 2nd. We are very pleased that Jurugo was accepted into one of the best secondary schools in Gulu District. He is such a good man.

All our young men have helped build our houses while the girls have kept them fed. Lots of hard work. As always, it gets quiet here when they go back to school, and I go to the USA. We will leave 5 adults and 3 children at home. Danga is back home, and his wife and baby will follow soon.

Pray for Us

1. Keep us in prayer as the family and ministry grow and we all bond.
2. I had a serious gut bug in January and had IVs at home that I managed for several weeks. I am finally back to myself. There are so many diseases Satan would love to discourage me with, but through it all, I stay the course. Thank you, Lord, that when I am weak, You are strong. **Continue to pray against the attacks of sickness.**
3. I am leaving on March 7th to have cataract surgery on both eyes at the Spokane VA Hospital. I will be with my daughter and grands for 2 months. My heart is expectantly overjoyed.
4. The construction work will continue while I am away. We have 3 great masons working for us, along with Simon, Moses, and Danga. **Pray for their safety and quick work.**
5. Contact me to get together while I am in Spokane. **Pray for quick healing, good rest, and uneventful traveling from here to the States.**



Needs

1. It will cost \$5,800 for a more secure chain link fence around the 2 ½ acre residential area of the farm. The termites keep eating the wood poles of our barb wire.
2. The estimate is \$1,700 for solar security lights and cameras.
3. A solar refrigerator is \$1,100, and it's a luxury I've not had for 15 years.
4. Finishing the houses should cost about \$1,500.
