We have audited the accompanying financial statements of Democracy Works, Inc. (a nonprofit organization), which comprise the statements of financial position as of December 31, 2016 and 2015, and the related statements of activities and cash flows for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America; this includes the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Note 1 - Organization and Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**a - Organization**

Democracy Works, Inc. ("Democracy Works") is a nonpartisan, 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization dedicated to the idea that voting should fit the way we live. Democracy Works is a team of software developers, public policy wonks, and civic organizers building the tools needed to upgrade the infrastructure of our democracy and improve the voting experience for voters and election officials alike. Our vision is straightforward: make voting a simple, seamless experience for all Americans so that no one misses an election.

Democracy Works' first offering was TurboVote, an online service to help every American vote in every election - local, state, and national. Users who need to register or vote by mail receive completed forms with an addressed, stamped envelope to make voting easier. All users who opt in get text and email reminders with important election information, key dates, and deadlines.

Ballot Scout, Democracy Works' second product, helps local election administrators track absentee ballots by the tens of thousands as they travel through the mail, providing transparency in the vote-by-mail process and making it easier to follow up when things go awry. The Organization also works with the Pew Charitable Trusts and Google to ensure that the Voting Information Project's data is up-to-date and ready from one election to the next, for the millions and millions of voters who rely on it.

b - Contributions and Unconditional Promises to Give

Contributions received are recorded as unrestricted, temporarily restricted or permanently restricted support, depending on the existence and/or nature of any donor restrictions. Contributions are recognized when the donor makes a promise to give to Democracy Works, that is, in substance, unconditional. Donor-restricted contributions are reported as increases in temporarily or permanently restricted net assets depending on the nature of the restrictions. When a restriction expires, temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted net assets.

The Organization uses the allowance method to determine uncollectible promises to give. Such allowance, when necessary, is based on prior years' experience and management's analysis of specific promises made.

c - Donated Services

Donated services are recognized as contributions at fair value if the services require specialized skills, are performed by people with those skills, and would otherwise be purchased.

d - Accounts Receivable

Democracy Works does not anticipate any losses on accounts receivable at December 31, 2016.

e - Property and Equipment

Purchased property and equipment acquired are recorded at cost. Property and equipment are being depreciated using the straight-line method over the estimated useful life of the asset. Democracy Works has a policy to capitalize purchases of over \$5,000 that have a useful life of more than a year.

f - Deferred Rent

The aggregate of the total minimum lease payments is required to be recorded on a straight-line basis over the term of the lease. The difference between the straight-line expense and amounts paid in accordance with the terms of its lease is recorded as deferred rent in the statement of financial position.

g - Program Fees

Program fees are deferred when received and recognized as revenue in the period the services are provided.

h - Financial Statement Presentation

Democracy Works reports information regarding its financial position and activities according to the three classes of net assets: unrestricted net assets, temporarily restricted net assets and permanently restricted net assets.

i - Estimates

Democracy Works uses estimates and assumptions in preparing financial statements. Those estimates and assumptions affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, the disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities, and the reported revenues and expenses.

j - Functional Allocation of Expenses

The cost of providing the various program and supporting services has been summarized on a functional basis in the statement of activities. Accordingly, certain costs have been allocated among the program and supporting services in reasonable ratios determined by management.

k - Tax Status

Democracy Works, Inc. is a not-for-profit corporation exempt from federal income taxes under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and has been designated as an organization which is not a private foundation.

l - Subsequent Events

Democracy Works has evaluated subsequent events through October 31, 2017, the date that the financial statements are considered available to be issued.

Note 2 - Temporarily Restricted Net Assets

Temporarily restricted net assets are designated by the donors for future periods and programs.

Note 3 - Promises to Give

a - Unconditional Promises to Give

Unconditional promises to give are temporarily restricted and are due as follows:

Approximately 74% of unconditional promises to give as of December 31, 2016 are due from one corporation. Approximately 83% of unconditional promises to give as of December 31, 2015 are due from two donors. Uncollectable promises to give are expected to be insignificant.

b - Conditional Grant

During 2015, Democracy Works was awarded a grant totaling \$600,000, of which \$300,000 is conditional on achieving specific goals and programmatic metrics for the period ending November 30, 2016. These conditions were satisfied and this amount was recognized in March 2017.
