- Maintenance that's acknowledged, but rarely prioritized

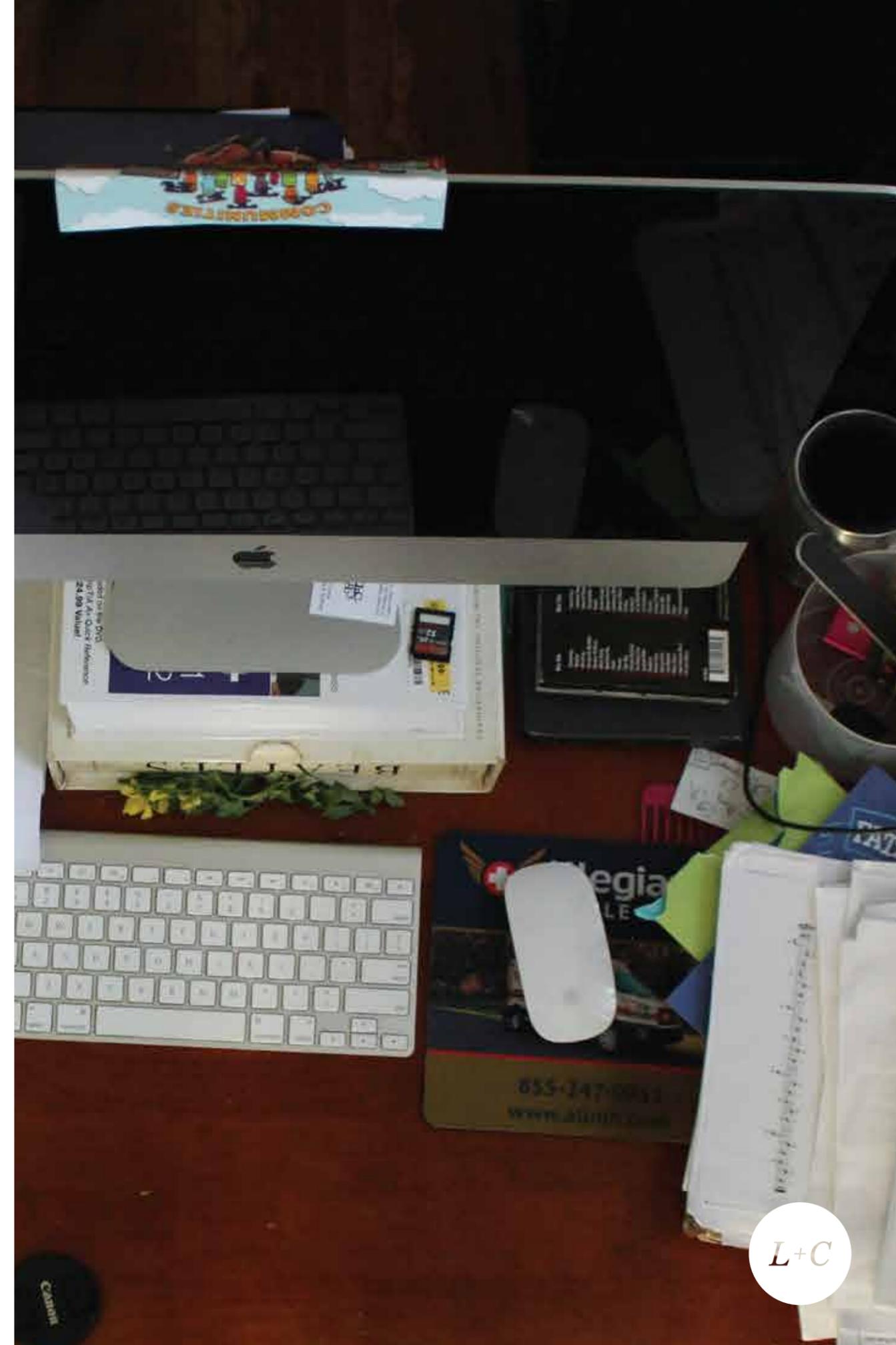


Why marketing becomes a weak spot.

Does this require my expertise or decision-making?

If the answer is no, it may not need to stay on your plate.

2

Would this suffer if it were handled by someone else?

If the answer is no — that's information.

3

Is this ongoing or one-time?

Ongoing work is often better handled by someone who can maintain it consistently.

4

Does this task drain or distract me?

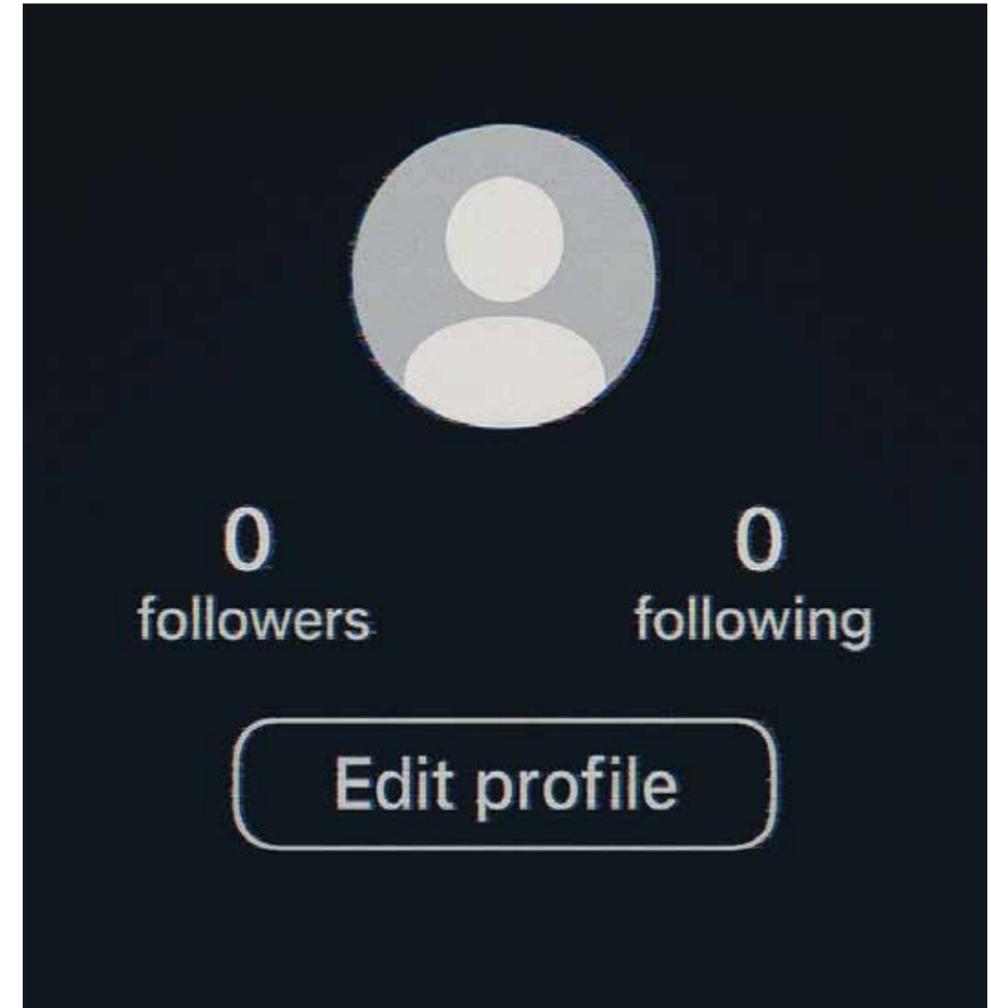
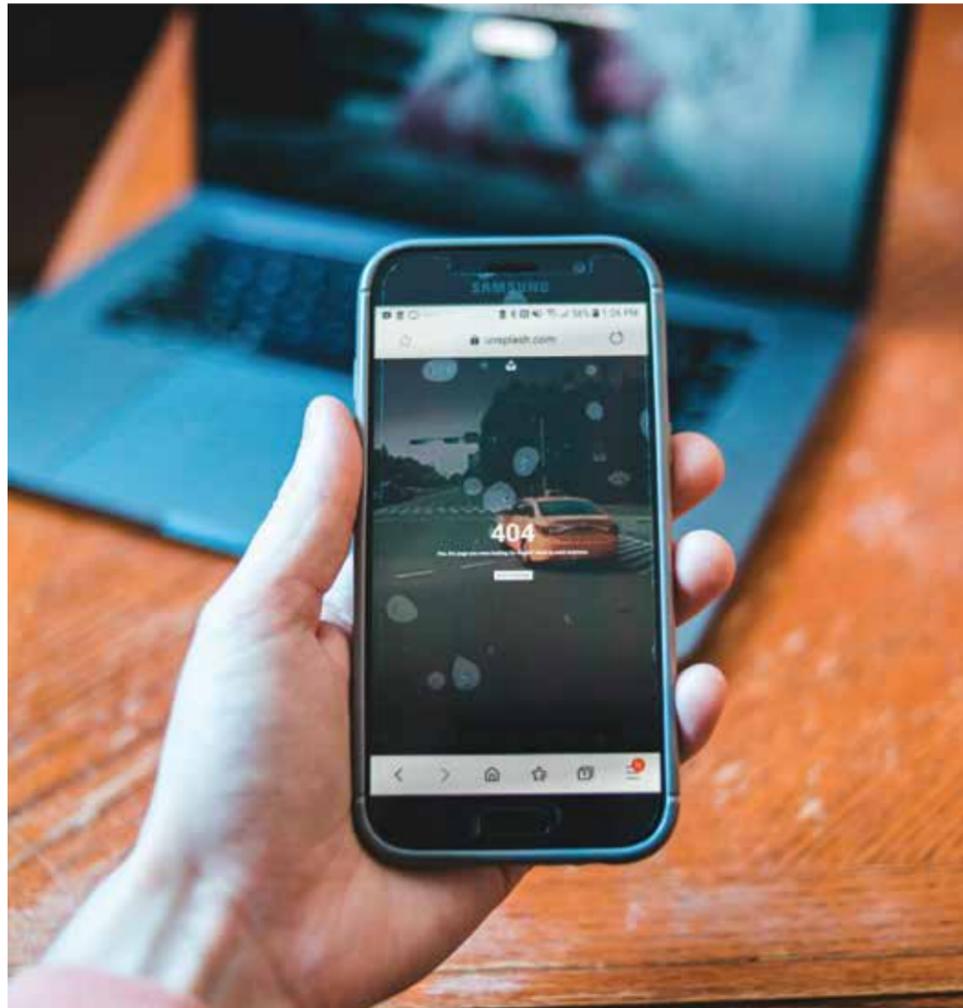
Energy matters. Friction compounds over time.

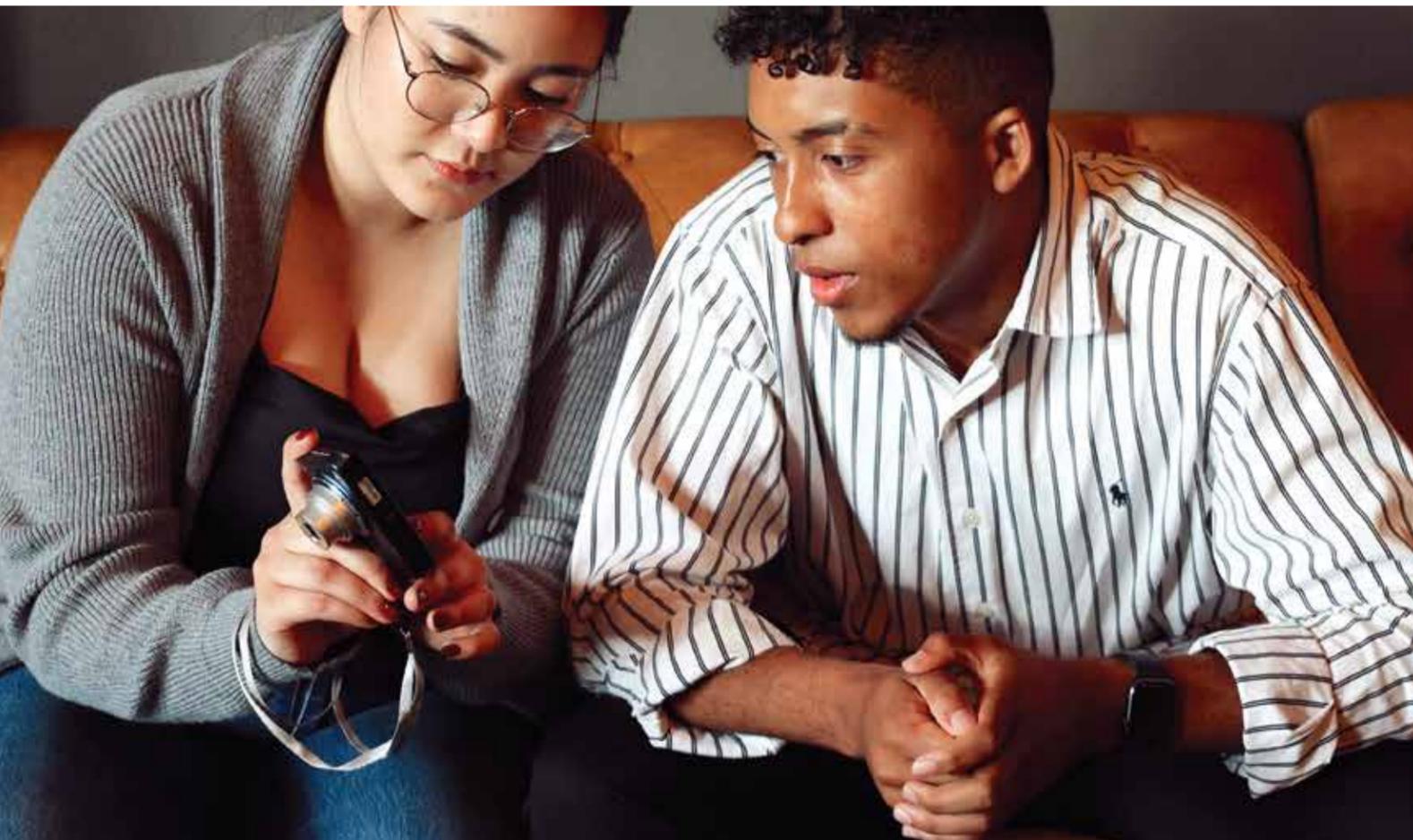

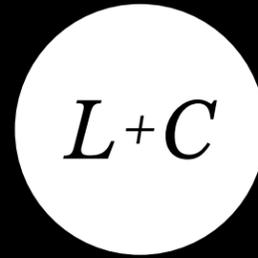
