WHAT REALLY HAPPENS WHEN YOU DIP YOUR HAND IN HOLY WATER

Many Catholics touch holy water every day without thinking. Some see it as a simple church tradition. Others treat it like a small blessing, nothing more. But here is the truth:

□ When you dip your hand in holy water, something supernatural happens. Not symbolic. Not psychological. Real. Let's break it down slowly, clearly, and beautifully.

1. HOLY WATER IS NOT ORDINARY WATER Holy water is not blessed for decoration. It is blessed with a prayer of exorcism and a prayer of sanctification. The Church asks God to: drive away evil, protect His children, and renew the grace of baptism. This means: □ Holy water carries the power of Christ and the authority of the Church.

2. WHEN YOUR FINGERS TOUCH IT, YOU ARE TOUCHING YOUR BAPTISM Every time you dip your hand in holy water, you are doing something deeply spiritual: You are reminding your soul who you are. The Church teaches: Holy water recalls your baptism and renews the grace of that sacrament. In baptism: your sins were washed away, you were claimed by Christ, you became a child of God, you were sealed against the devil. Holy water pulls your soul back to that reality. It is not magic. It is a sacred reminder with real spiritual effect.

3. THE SIGN OF THE CROSS IS A DECLARATION OF IDENTITY When you dip your hand and make the sign of the Cross, you are not making a gesture. You are making a statement: I belong to the Father. I am saved by the Son. I am strengthened by the Holy Spirit. I reject the devil. I walk in the power of the Cross. The early Christians used the sign of the Cross as a spiritual shield. We still do today.

□ **4. YOU RENEW YOUR PROMISE TO RENOUNCE EVIL**

At baptism you said (through your parents or personally): I renounce Satan. I renounce sin. I renounce darkness. Holy water puts this commitment back on your lips and heart. It silently says: □ "I refuse anything that separates me from Jesus." This is why holy water weakens temptation. It strengthens the will. It awakens the conscience. It calls back a distracted heart.

□ **5. HOLY WATER IS A SPIRITUAL WEAPON** The Church has always used holy water to: protect homes, bless people, drive away the enemy, purify places, and guard the soul. The prayer said by the priest when blessing it includes: "Let no power of the enemy remain." This is why saints used it daily. They knew holy water carries the authority of Christ over darkness. When you touch it, you are not touching a ritual. You are touching protection.

□ **6. YOU ENTER GOD'S HOUSE PROPERLY** Dipping your hand in holy water at the entrance is powerful: It prepares your heart. It cleans your spirit. It focuses your mind. It tells heaven: "I am coming before the Lord with a clean heart." It is like washing your hands before a holy meal.

□ **7. SCRIPTURE'S ROOTS: WATER THAT PURIFIES AND PROTECTS** Holy water is not invented by the Church. In Scripture, God uses water as: cleansing (Psalm 51:2, Ezekiel 36:25) deliverance (Red Sea, Exodus 14) healing (Naaman in 2 Kings 5) birth into new life (John 3:5) Jesus Himself used water to bring salvation. The Church continues this divine pattern.

□ **WHAT REALLY HAPPENS?** When you dip your hand in holy water: You awaken your baptism. You recall your identity. You chase away darkness. You renew your spirit. You declare your faith. You prepare your soul for worship. You touch a grace that flows from Christ Himself. It is not small. It is not ordinary. It is not routine. It is a moment of power. Every single time. God bless you.

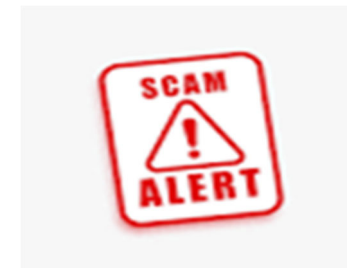

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From the Desk of Father Hamness:

I want to remind you about a scam that's been going around again. Some of you have reported getting messages—whether by text, email, or phone—from people pretending to be me. These scammers often ask for gift cards or money, claiming it's for something urgent, like helping someone in the parish or buying supplies for the church. What's especially tricky is that these scams usually seem to happen when I am out of town, which is why I no longer put it in the bulletin if I am going to be away from the parish. The scammers use this to create a sense of urgency, hoping you won't take the time to double-check. Please know that I would never ask for financial help or favors like this. If you ever get a request like this, it's not from me. If you're ever unsure about a message, don't hesitate to contact the parish office directly to check. And if you think you've been contacted by a scammer, let us know right away or report it to the authorities.

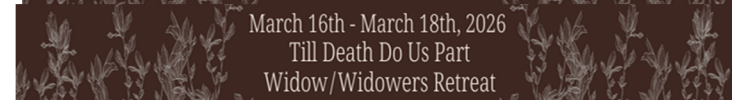
