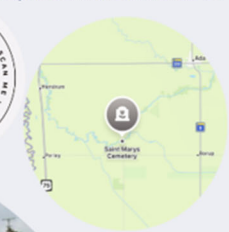

Flower Carpets!

That's an interesting headline. One of the beautiful customs of parishes that have a procession with the Blessed Sacrament today is to carpet the pathway for the priest carrying the monstrance with a carpet made of flower petals. These "carpets" are often beautiful multi-color designs that include various symbolic images of elements of our faith. The priest leads the Eucharistic procession while carrying the monstrance, with the exception of the altar servers holding the thurible and the candles, who walk on the outside of the carpet, so that it remains pristine for the passage of the priest carrying the Blessed Sacrament. Naturally these images are spoiled by the priest walking on them, but that is the point. Nothing is too good or too much effort for our Lord's glory and honor!

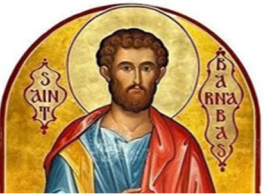
