DO THE DEAD KNOW WHEN WE PRAY FOR THEM?

It is a question that touches something very human. When we pray for someone who has died... When we offer a Mass for them...When we whisper their name before God... Do they know? Does the soul somehow become aware that we are praying? The Church approaches this mystery with both faith and humility.

THE COMMUNION THAT DEATH DOES NOT BREAK

In Christian belief, death does not destroy the bond between members of the Church. The Church exists in three states: • The faithful on earth• The souls being purified• The saints in heaven. All remain united in what is called the Communion of Saints within the Catholic Church. Because of this unity, prayer flows across the boundary of death.

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
