TYPES OF CATHOLICS

In the Catholic Church, "types of Catholic" refer to different rites, religious groups, and ways Catholics live their faith. All are united in the same faith founded by Jesus Christ through the Church.

1. ROMAN CATHOLIC (LATIN CHURCH)



The largest group; follow the Latin Rite; led by the Pope; common devotions include Rosary, Eucharistic Adoration, Novenas.

2. EASTERN CATHOLICS



Fully united with the Pope but follow Eastern traditions, liturgy, and spirituality. Examples: Ukrainian Greek, Maronite, Syro-Malabar, Melkite, Chaldean. Different liturgical styles, become priests in some traditions.

3. RELIGIOUS ORDERS



Catholics who dedicate their lives to specific spiritual works: Benedictines - prayer and work; Franciscans - poverty and service to the poor; Dominicans - preaching and teaching; Jesuits - education and missions; Carmelites - prayer and contemplation.

4. LAY CATHOLICS



Ordinary faithful who live their faith in daily life (parents, students, workers, youth, parish volunteers) serving God through prayer, family life, charity, and witnessing to Christ.

5. CULTURAL CATHOLIC EXPRESSIONS



Catholic faith expressed differently around the world. Examples of Marian devotions: Our Lady of Guadalupe, Our Lady of Fatima.

IMPORTANT TO REMEMBER

There are many expressions and traditions, but there is only one Catholic Church — united in one faith, one baptism, one Eucharist, one Pope, one Lord: Jesus Christ. As the Bible says: "There is one body and one Spirit... one Lord, one faith, one baptism." (Ephesians 4:4-5)
