

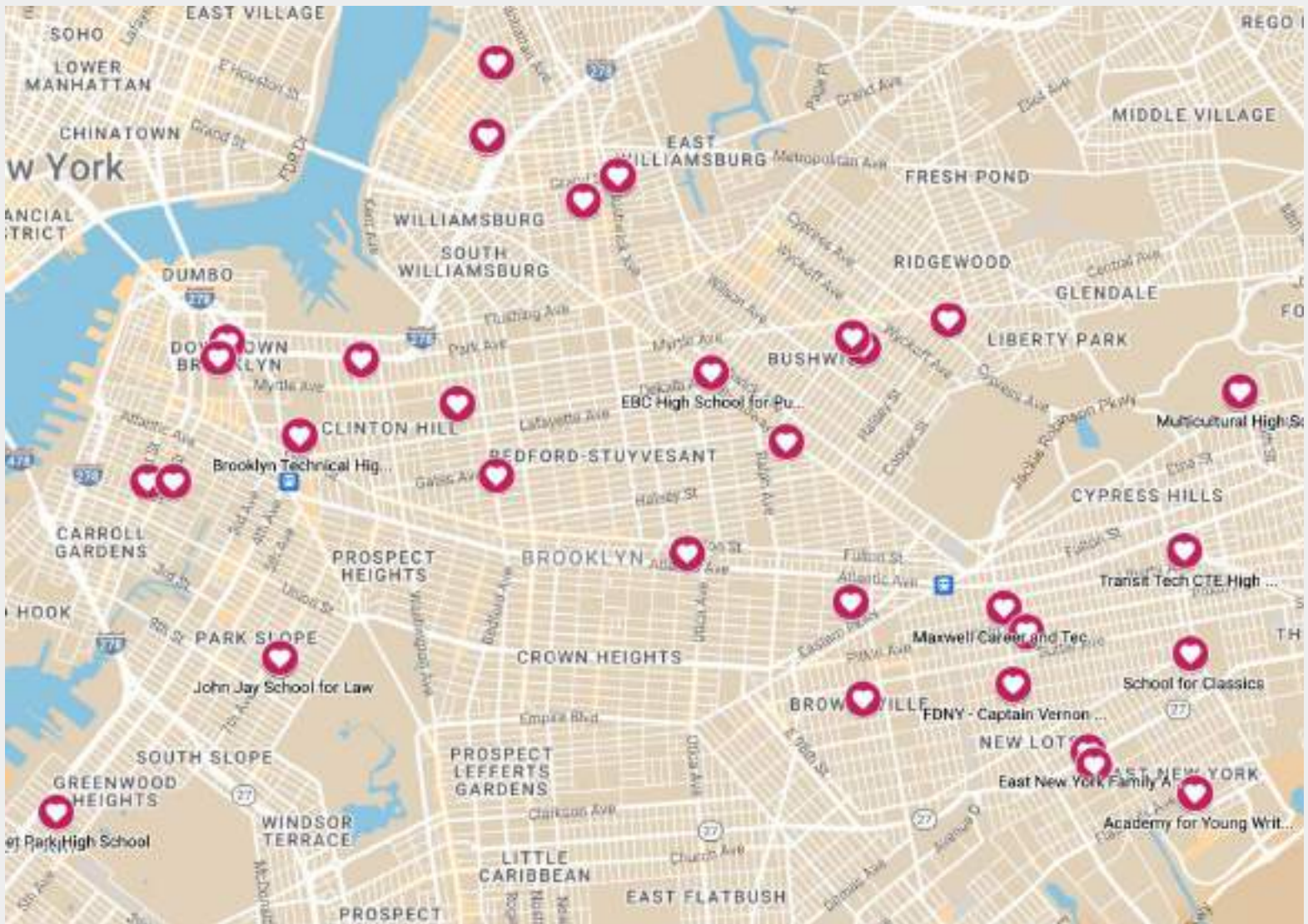

Brooklyn North High Schools - District Goals

Centering Children + Leading with Love + Innovating for Tomorrow

Goal 1: (DCEP) Priority 4

By June 2026, BKNHS schools will ensure all students graduate college and career ready and have a strong plan and pathway to economic security.

As a result, enrollment in advanced courses for all students will increase by 3% to 77%; a college and career advising session for all students will increase by 6% to 95% (with comparable increases for subgroups of ST11 & SWD); and the number of schools offering the New York State Seal of Biliteracy (NYSSB) to all students will increase by 1 to 20 schools.

Goal 2: Priorities 1 & 3

By June 2026, all BKNHS schools will provide student learning experiences that are literacy-based, culturally responsive and sustaining, include standards-aligned curricula with formative assessments for progress monitoring, differentiated to meet student needs, and integrates highly impactful instructional practices.

As a result, average district Regents scores for all students will increase by 3-7 points for ELA and Algebra I.

Goal 3: Priority 2 & Attendance

DCEP Priority 2 & Attendance. By June 2026, BKNHS will provide holistic instructional programs in which all students have access to opportunities that are meaningful, inform purpose, inspire activism, and aligned to support viable college and career pathways post-high school. School stakeholders will organize systems and structures to ensure an emotionally and physically safe learning environment that effectively engages students.

As a result, we will decrease high level infractions (level 4/5) by 3%, reduce repeat suspensions by 2%, increase student connectedness by 5%, increase attendance by 2%, and reduce chronic absenteeism by 3%.

Goal 4: Priority 5

By June 2026, all BKNHS schools will expand family involvement and increase enrollment through Collaboration with community stakeholders and external partners; and empowering parents to be supporters, monitors, and advocates to sustain and advance student academic outcomes and personal success.

As a result, the NYC School Survey family responses will reflect a 2-percentage point increase in affirmative responses on school events and communicating with teachers. Enrollment at our 5 smallest schools will increase by an average of 5%.

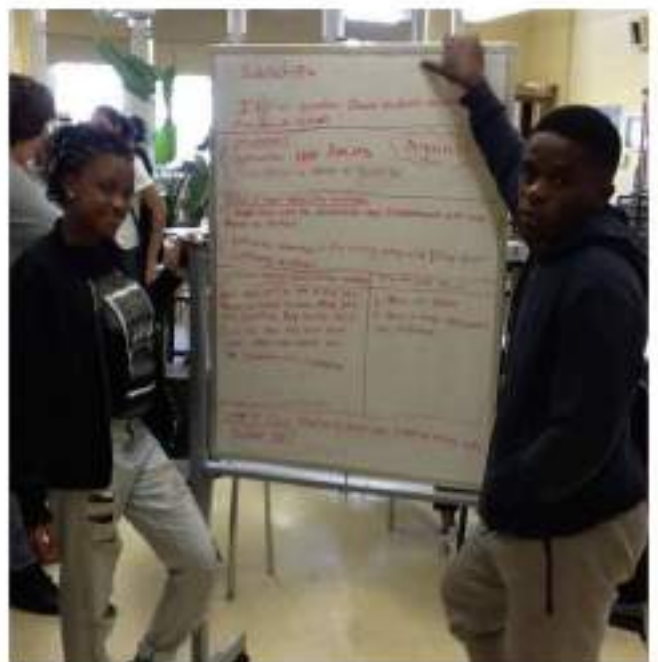
We are an **AVID** (Advancement via Individual Determination) school. Students receive training on acquiring academic behaviors to become ready for college-level classes and instruction.

LEADERSHIP CADET MODEL

The Leadership Cadet Model is a central aspect of our school community. This program helps students enhance their leadership skills by teaching the core values of scholarship, character and service. All students in the 9th and 10th grades are required to attend the Friday Night Cadet Training Courses. Students in 9th grade can opt into a four commitment in our NCO School. Bard High School Early College Brooklyn

Our Impact in NYC

- In 2020, The Education Trust found that the NYC Bard Early Colleges have the highest on-time bachelor's degree completion for low-income students of all public schools in New York State.
- According to an independent study in NYC, Bard graduates are nearly twice as likely as graduates of traditional NYC schools to earn a bachelor's degree within four years, controlling for academic and demographic characteristics.
- In the first 20 years of Bard Early College, over **4,400 AA degrees** have been conferred and over **350,000 credits** awarded, all entirely free of cost to students and their families.

Launched in 2024, Bard High School Early College Brooklyn (BHSEC Brooklyn) is a new and innovative public early college high school in the East New York neighborhood of Brooklyn. A collaboration between Bard College and the New York City Department of Education, BHSEC Brooklyn will offer young people a set of extraordinary opportunities, including:

- Enabling students to graduate from high school with **60 transferable college credits** and a Bard College AA degree, entirely free of cost.
- A core curriculum in the **liberal arts and sciences**,
- Extensive **college and career guidance** & robust student support structures that attend to students' academic, social, and developmental needs.
- **Internships and applied learning opportunities**

All BHSEC Brooklyn students will begin undergraduate study after the 10th grade, replacing the traditional 11th and 12th grades with two years of rigorous and supportive college curriculum. Within four years, students earn two credentials: A NYS high school diploma and a Bard College Associate in Arts degree, all tuition free. Prioritizing 30% enrollment for Brooklyn residents, BHSEC Brooklyn seeks students of all academic backgrounds.

Bard Early College is a network of ten satellite campuses of Bard College. By bringing high school and college together, Bard Early College offers students deep immersion in the liberal arts and sciences and helps students access, afford, and complete higher education.

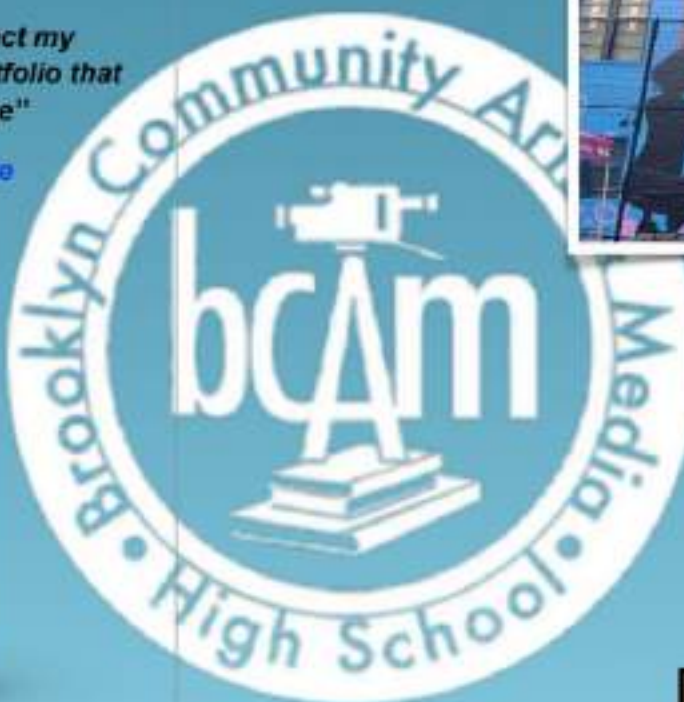

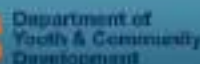

Brooklyn Technical High School is the nation's largest specialized public high school for science, technology, engineering and mathematics. Housed in a physical plant reborn for the 21st century, the school is a national model for excellence. Recognized as a Blue Ribbon School, a New American High School, a Project Lead The Way Model High School, and an Intel School of Distinction in Science, Brooklyn Tech is also annually recognized in both US News and Newsweek as a Gold Medal School and is currently ranked the 71st best high school in the country. In addition, Brooklyn Tech ranked 1st in the nation in the Niche Standout High School rankings which ranks schools with at least 50% of students identified as economically disadvantaged.

Tech has a stimulating environment that fosters transformational education and personal growth in classrooms and labs which are on par with university and industry standards. With modern technology at its core, Brooklyn Tech serves as a vibrant intellectual arena for faculty and students to explore and embrace the ideas, technology and instructional methods that will shape the future.

All of the 6,000 students attending Brooklyn Tech reside in the five boroughs of New York City. The majority of the students are multi-lingual and over 61% are entitled to free or reduced lunch. Brooklyn Tech has 279 full time faculty members. 92% of the faculty currently hold advanced degrees and 13% hold terminal degrees.

DISTINGUISHING FEATURES

Admissions - Students interested in attending Brooklyn Tech must take the Specialized High Schools Admissions Test (SHSAT) administered by the New York City Department of Education. A student receives an offer to Tech based solely on his/her test score, how he/she ranked the school among the other specialized high schools, and seat availability. On average, approximately 30,000 8th and 9th graders take the test each year with between 1,450 and 1,550 being admitted into the incoming cohort.

Alumni Foundation - A unique feature of Brooklyn Tech is its strong alumni network, with over 60,000 stakeholders in our school. Brooklyn Tech has a strategic partnership with the Foundation which provides administrative support for internships, mentorships, Career Day, Recent Alumni Day, Ruby Engineers (for young women's leadership), and a remarkable annual Homecoming event. The Foundation also generously supports (both financially and experientially) teacher professional development, new programs and initiatives, enhanced instructional programs for students, facilities improvements and renovations, and technology upgrades.

Project Lead the Way (Engineering) - a world-class, activity driven, project and problem based curriculum in STEM fields crafted by teams of industry professionals and collegiate faculty. College credit is granted through a consortium of state specific institutions (Rochester Institute of Technology in NY) based on cumulative performance and achievement on the final exams.

Weston Research Scholars Program - provides gifted students with a three-year opportunity to participate in the creation of new knowledge through scientific investigation at graduate and post-graduate levels. It is unique in its structure incorporating an internal mentor model consisting of Brooklyn Tech teachers with research experience, a summer institute to prepare students, student research teams, on-going activities through the academic year and summer and external mentors at colleges, universities and research facilities.

Consistent with the National Consortium of Secondary STEM Schools, BTHS does not rank students except to determine the Valedictorian (highest weighted GPA) and Salutatorian (second highest weighted GPA). Courses worth college credit through Advanced Placement or formal articulation agreements with colleges and/or universities are weighted at 1.1 only in the cumulative GPA; actual transcript course grades are not weighted.

THE BTHS INSTRUCTIONAL MODEL

Ninth and Tenth Grades: The mandated 9th grade Design & Drawing for Production class, which satisfies the New York State Arts requirement for graduation, is a foundation course through Project Lead The Way that immerses students in the design process from brainstorming to prototyping through 3D printing. Students use industry standard 3D modeling software (Autodesk Inventor) to complete both individual and team oriented projects honing student communication skills in graphic form with an equal emphasis on oral presentation. During 10th grade, all students are mandated to take AP Principles of Computer Science. During the spring semester of the tenth grade, students must participate in the “Major Selection Process” which enables them to list each major in order of preference from a set of 18 options. Placement in a major is based on a combination of student preference and prior academic performance.

Eleventh and Twelfth Grades: Majors include at least **2** periods of instruction junior year and at least **3** periods of instruction senior year. The 18 Majors are: Aerospace Engineering; Architectural Engineering, Biological Sciences, Chemical Engineering, Civil Engineering, Electrical Engineering, Environmental Science, Finance, Industrial Design, Law and Society, LIU Pharmacy, Mathematics, Mechatronics and Robotics, Digital Media, Neuroscience, Physics, Social Science Research, and Software Engineering.

Career and Technical Education Endorsement – Students in the Media, Civil, Architecture, Aerospace Engineering, Industrial Design, Electrical Engineering, Software Engineering, and Mechatronics majors are eligible to receive a CTE Endorsed diploma. This means that students must complete a specific sequence of courses, receive professional certifications recognized by the relevant industry, and have career and work-based learning, training, and/or experiences.

Advanced Placement – We offer a wide array of Advanced Placement courses, our menu includes: Studio Art, Comparative Government and Politics, Human Geography, Psychology, Computer Science A, Computer Science Principles, Biology, Chemistry, Environmental Science, Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Chinese Language and Culture, English Language and Composition, European History, French Language and Culture, Italian Language and Culture, Macroeconomics, Microeconomics, Physics I, Physics 2, Physics B, Physics C, Research, Seminar, African American Studies, Spanish Language and Culture, Statistics, United States Government and Politics, United States History, World History.

MISSION

The Brooklyn Latin School provides a specialized, classical education, including the study of Latin, in a disciplined academic environment. Our curriculum provides the groundwork for an understanding of the foundation of our society, while developing the leadership capacity of our students so that they may serve as leaders in their communities.

ADMISSIONS

The Brooklyn Latin School is one of nine specialized high schools in New York City that aims to provide an education tailored to the city's most advanced students. As with all specialized high schools, our sole admission criterion is the Specialized High Schools Admissions Test (SHSAT), typically given in October or November of each year, which is available to all children residing in New York City in the eighth and ninth grade. Neither interviews nor middle school grades are necessary, as they cannot be used to determine eligibility to attend TBLS.

CURRICULUM

The Brooklyn Latin School offers a liberal arts curriculum with an emphasis on the classics and Latin language instruction. Our curriculum emphasizes a core knowledge of the liberal arts that students will use as the basis for further, more detailed exploration. All students are required to complete four years of Latin, English, history, mathematics, science, and at least two years of Spanish or Greek. In humanities classes, students participate in Socratic seminars and declamation (public speaking exercises). Non-humanities classes feature labs, math expositions and other inquiry-based methods. In all classes, students can expect a strong – and continuing – emphasis on structured writing and public speaking, as well as an overarching practice of the kind of analytical thinking that will ensure that all TBLS students are prepared for the rigors of college work.

SEMINAR

Like the great ancient philosopher Socrates, The Brooklyn Latin School believes that an education does not mean simply filling a student with information. Rather, an education must encourage a student to realize their potential for discovery and independent thought. Socratic seminars allow students to discuss and debate academic topics in a controlled classroom environment and achieve their own insights through informed conversation.

LATIN

The Brooklyn Latin School requires four years of Latin instruction, which lies at the core of our classical liberal arts curriculum. The study of Latin puts students in touch with the great thinkers of the past – from Plato to Cicero to Erasmus. In addition, the study of Latin has been widely shown to improve students' English reading and writing abilities by acquainting them with the grammatical structures on which our own language is founded. In keeping with our classical tradition, all students are expected to regularly participate in Socratic seminars and declamation.

DECLAMATION

The Brooklyn Latin School subscribes to the classical belief that to be a leader in any field, academic or otherwise, one needs to be well-spoken and have a command of oratorical skills. Research has shown that those trained to speak well develop sharper memories and better writing skills. Many classes, including all humanities, hold regular declamations in which students must memorize and recite relevant texts either assigned by the teacher or chosen independently. In addition, there are school-wide public declamations, for which auditions are held.

UNIFORM

One of the most visible markers of a community is the uniformity that bridges together students from diverse backgrounds to represent the harmony that welcomes them here. The Brooklyn Latin School upholds a dress code that is strictly enforced. Students are expected to be in full uniform during the school day and we provide items to students who need them. Amendment to the uniform are only allowed for documented medical or religious reasons.

EXTRACURRICULARS

One of the ways our students build their character and leadership skills is through our clubs program. The Brooklyn Latin School is part of the Public Schools Athletic League (PSAL). With our two other PSAL schools who share this campus, we offer a combination of joint and TBLS-exclusive activities. Sports offered are volleyball, basketball, badminton, track, soccer and more. Extracurricular clubs shift yearly based on student interest. We offer affinity clubs, artistic clubs, leadership clubs, performance clubs and special interest clubs. Our clubs are student-led and faculty and staff supported.

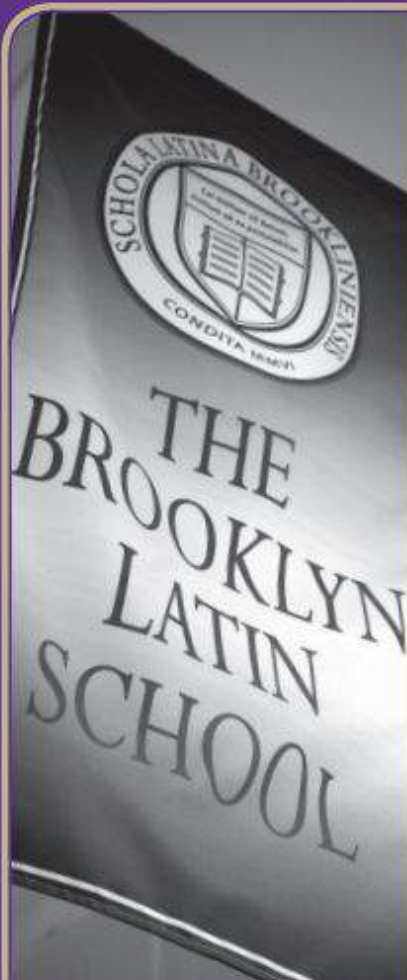

The IB program has three additional core requirements: a 4,000-word extended essay; a Theory of Knowledge course; and a Creativity, Activity and Service requirement in which students engage in personally and socially relevant projects outside of the classroom.

At The Brooklyn Latin School, we believe that the IB program plays an integral part in fulfilling the school's mission. The program prepares our students for the rigors of college and fosters their development as caring citizens in a global world.

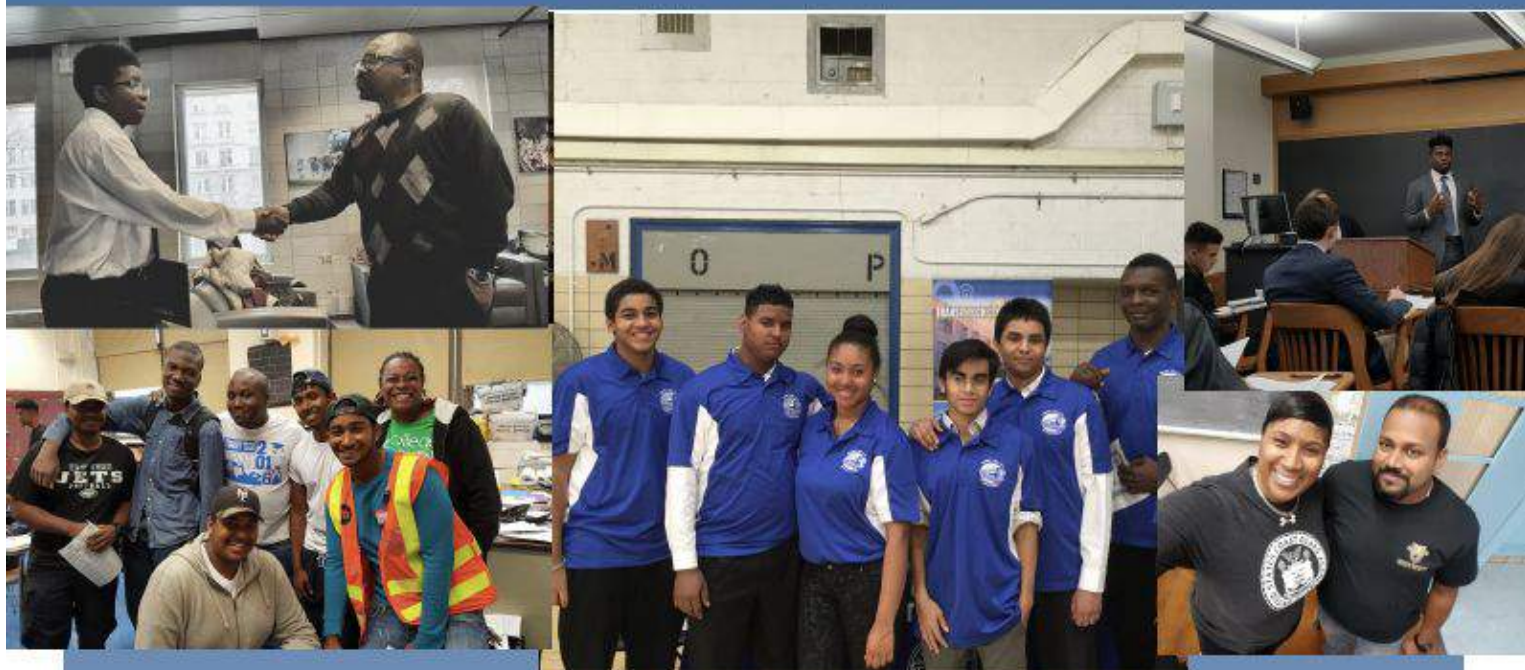
