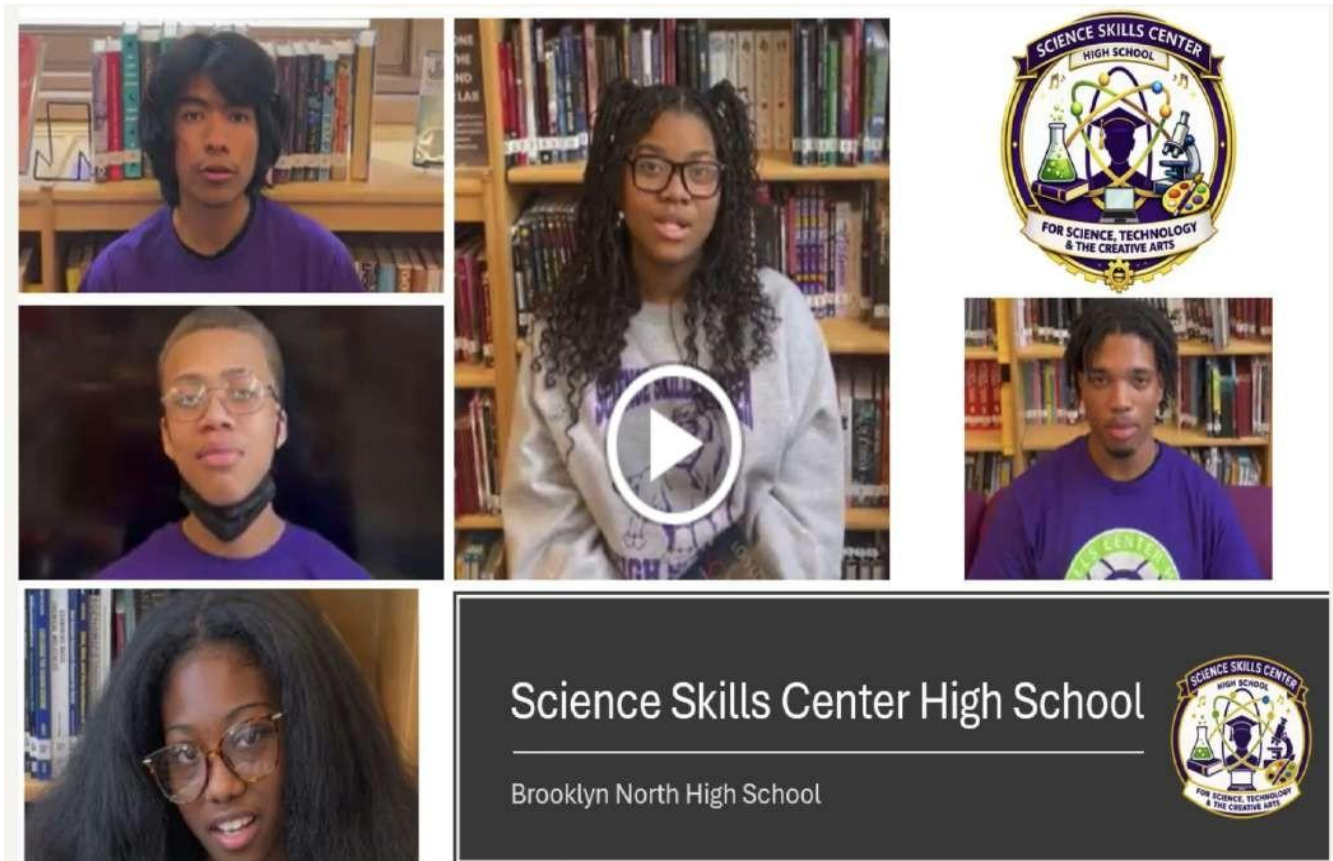

Brooklyn North HS held its 2nd Annual MBK THRIVE Awards at the Kumble Theater at LIU on Thursday, June 11. Students, advisors, and leaders across the district were welcomed and celebrated to end the 2025-2026 calendar year.

THRIVE - *Together*ness, *Health & Wellness*, *Respect*, *Inspire*, *Vision*, and *Excellence* - are the tenets that guide and inform the MBK platform. This year we recognized three categories of distinction:

Bringing Science Home

Long before students step into a science classroom, they begin exploring the world with the people around them. Every question asked, every trip to the park, every conversation about how something works helps build the curiosity that is at the heart of science. While our students are the scientists in our classrooms, families are often the first to inquire a lifelong love of discovery.

This newsletter is designed to help families continue that journey of discovery together. In each issue, you'll find free and low-cost opportunities, local resources, and engaging experiences that connect to classroom learning and help make science meaningful, relevant, and fun for the whole family. Science learning doesn't end when the school day ends—or even when the school year ends. New York City is full of opportunities for families to connect what students are learning in school to the world around them. From museums and gardens, to community events and everyday experiences, science can be found in every neighborhood and in countless moments of daily life.

Together, we can nurture curiosity, deepen understanding, and help students see science not just as a subject, but as a way of understanding and appreciating the world around them.

**Science in the Community:
 Windscape (Brooklyn Waterfront)**

Windscape Brooklyn is a water front space where families can explore wind as both a natural phenomenon and a source of renewable energy. Visitors can observe how wind moves through an urban environment and connect those patterns to how wind turbines are designed to convert moving air into usable energy. [Click: Windscape Brooklyn](#)

Curriculum Connection:

In physics, students explore how forces and motion transfer energy through systems like moving air. Windscape connects directly to HS-PS2 (Forces and Motion) as families consider how wind energy can be captured and converted into electricity using turbines. It also connects to HS-ESS2 (Earth Systems) as students observe how local geographic weather patterns, and temperature differences shape wind behavior in real environments. Through HS-ETS1 (Engineering Design), families can think like engineers as they evaluate where wind turbines could be placed in a city like New York to maximize efficiency and sustainability. At Windscape, families can also explore interactive models on site and observe how wind turbines are already being integrated into urban spaces, helping shape the city's renewable energy future.



**Understanding Changes in the
 Science Regents**

You may have heard the term "cluster questions" as New York State science assessments continue to evolve. Cluster questions are a group of multiple-choice and short-answer questions connected to the same topic or scientific phenomenon.

As students work through a cluster, they are gradually introduced to additional information, data, diagrams, or scientific context. Students are then asked to apply what they have learned in class to analyze evidence, identify patterns, make connections, and explain their thinking. Rather than focusing on memorization alone, cluster questions encourage students to use their scientific knowledge and reasoning skills to make sense of new situations.

This approach reflects the type of learning taking place in today's science classrooms, where students use evidence and critical thinking to better understand the world around them.

BKNHS Celebrates 1st Annual NYS Seal of Biliteracy District Celebration

Brooklyn North proudly hosted its first annual New York State Seal of Biliteracy celebration, honoring the achievements of multilingual scholars across the district. The event brought together students from 19 schools—representing 30 participating schools districtwide—along with families, principals, and staff to celebrate students who have demonstrated high levels of proficiency in English and at least one additional language. Aligning with the district’s mission under Dr. Rushell White to center children, lead with love, and innovate for tomorrow, the ceremony highlighted multilingualism as a powerful asset that strengthens identity, expands opportunity, and prepares students for a global future. With languages including Spanish, French, Haitian Creole, Mandarin, Russian, Arabic, and Bangla represented, the celebration showcased the rich linguistic diversity of Brooklyn North and recognized the collective efforts of educators, families, and partners who support students in reaching this milestone. The event was further elevated by an electrifying performance from Creators Academy Modern Band, whose multilingual and multicultural songs brought the house down and captured the spirit of the celebration.

Advanced Placement Examination Season Kicks Off This May, over 10,000 students are sitting for more than 18,000 Advanced Placement exams over a two-week period – spanning 38 subjects from AP Calculus to AP Art History. This extraordinary volume of exam activity reflects the intentional work of our schools to expand access to advanced coursework, and it represents thousands of individual students stepping up to college-level challenges. Brooklyn North is showing up and showing out!

While AP students are testing, AP teachers are training! With the support of Dr. Ainsley Rudolfo, a cohort of Brooklyn North teachers is completing their third consecutive Saturday of professional development – building cross-curricular skills in AP Seminar. Participants are deepening their ability to analyze complex texts and real-world situations, construct evidence-based arguments, and collaborate across content areas to strengthen their AP Seminar practice. Brooklyn North is investing in the classroom – not just for this exam season, but for the next one.
