

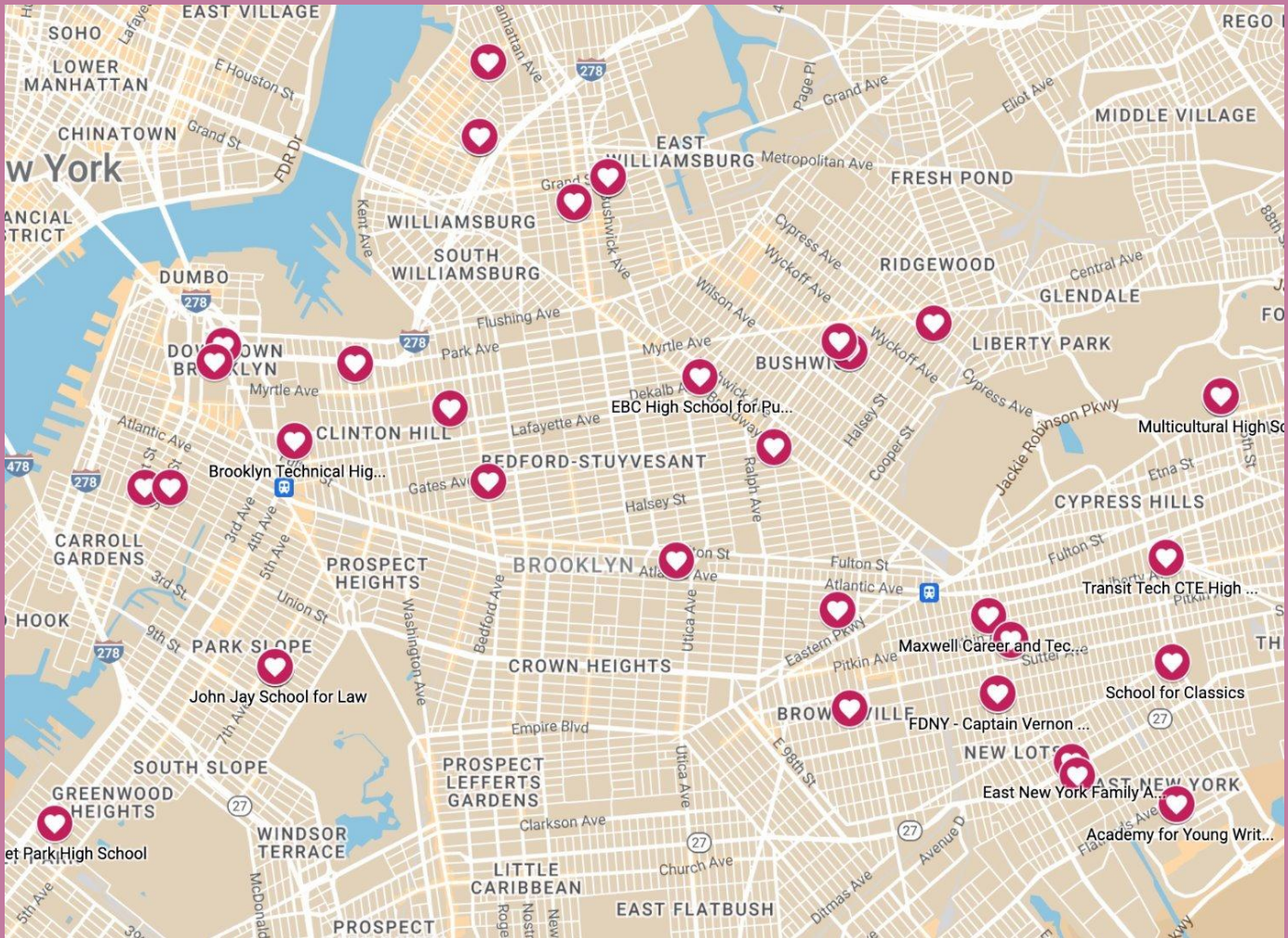

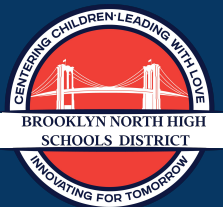


May 1, 2026 National Principal's Day

Our Senior Prom was a big success and certainly provided lasting memories.

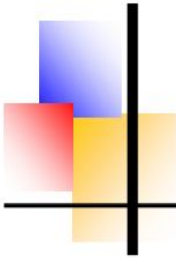
We held a moving National Honor Society Induction Ceremony.

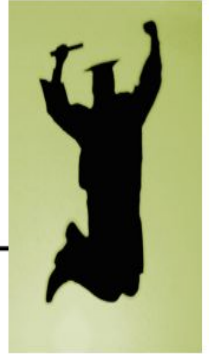

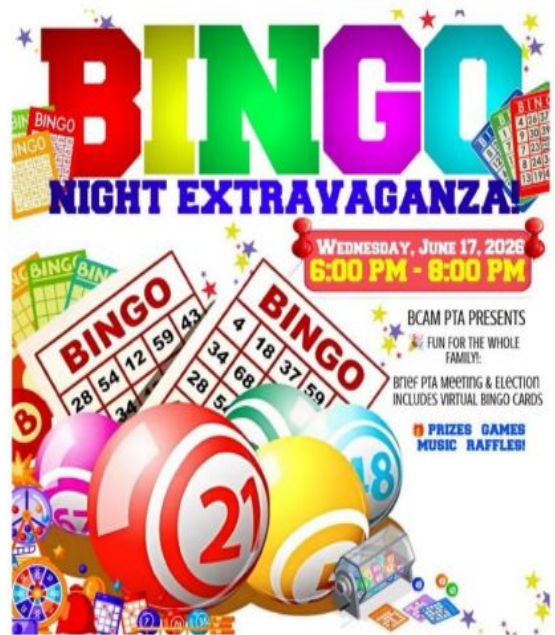

TechKnights Robotics Go to Worlds!

For the first time in 12 years, Tech's robotics team—FRC Team 334, the TechKnights—competed at the Robotics World Championship in Houston! The team punched their ticket to Worlds after a dominant run at the NYC Regional, where they placed 5th and won the Innovation in Control Award. In Houston, the team had an unforgettable trip, battling against top global opponents and proved that BTHS belongs on the world stage.



Rocketry soars

After months of planning, simulating, and launching, the Model Rocketry Club traveled to Manassas, Virginia, for at the 2026 American Rocketry Challenge Nationals. The stakes were incredibly precise: launch their rocket, **Eggcelsior**, to an exact altitude of 730 feet, maintain a flight duration of 36 to 39 seconds, and return an egg payload safely to earth. The team didn't podium, but represented the Tech community honorably and is already looking forward to next year.



Trout set free upstate

For the tenth year running, Dr. Margarita's Environmental Science students teamed up with NYC DEP, the Watershed Agricultural Council, Trout Unlimited, and NYS DEC to raise and release 100 trout eggs into the upstate NYC watershed. Students hatched, cared for, and even named their fish before the big release — a hands-on, splashy lesson in ecology, stewardship, and how small actions help our water.



Weston Research Stars Shine

Juniors Shivaii Nikam and Lily Korniewicz placed first at the 2026 Terra NYC STEM Fair, advancing as one of 13 projects chosen out of 500+ to represent NYC at the Regeneron International Science and Engineering Fair (ISEF) in Phoenix, Arizona. Competing in the Microbiology category with their project, "The

Effects of Microplastics from Menstrual Products on the Vaginal Microbiome," the duo won a 3rd Place Special Award and \$1,000 from The Knowledge Society. "Lily and Shivaii's achievement is a testament to their remarkable curiosity, resilience, and sense of purpose," said Weston Research teacher Dr. Michael A. Estrella. Congrats!

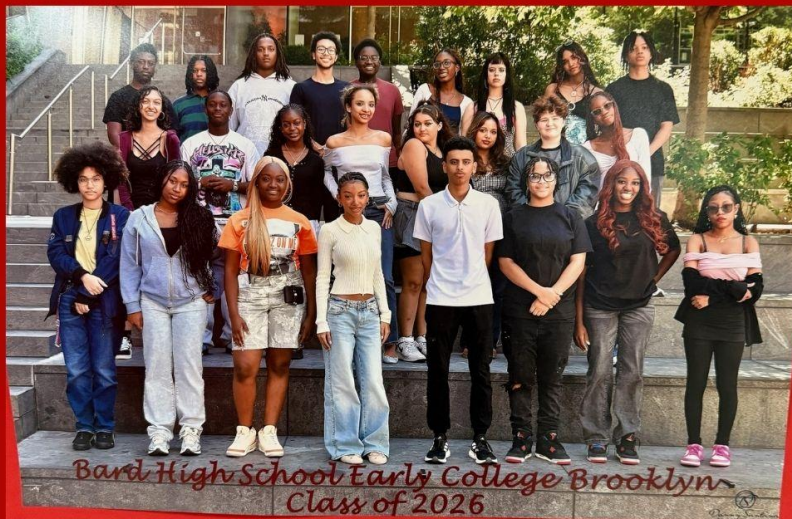

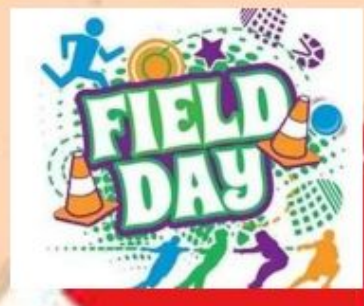

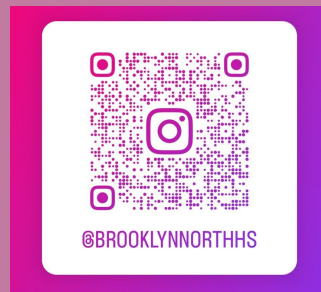
