

Phone Calls Asking for Money

Has anyone called you recently asking for money or information?



That kind of call is very common.

Banks, government offices, and police do not ask for money or codes over the phone.

If it happens, it's okay to hang up and check using a number you already trust.



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Urgent or Pressuring Requests

Has anyone ever told you something had to be done right away?

Scammers often create urgency so people do not have time to think.

Real organizations give you time.

Pausing is one of the best forms of protection.



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Grandparent or Family Emergency Scams

Have you ever received a call about a family emergency asking for money?



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There is currently a common scam where callers pretend to be a grandchild or relative.

It's okay to stop the call and check with another family member first.

Even real emergencies can wait for verification.



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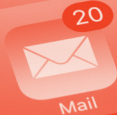
Texts and Emails that Look Official

Do you get texts or emails saying there's a problem with an account?



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Scam messages often look official
but contain links or urgent language.

It's safer not to click and to check
directly using a known website or
phone number.



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Requests for Secrecy

Has anyone ever asked you
not to tell anyone about a
request?



Requests for secrecy are a strong warning sign.

It's always okay to talk to family or the bank before doing anything.

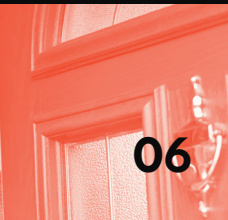


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Door-To-Door Visitors

Has anyone come to your door offering repairs or inspections?



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Scammers can show up in person.
You do not have to open the door or
agree to anything on the spot.
It's okay to say no and check later.



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What to Do When Unsure

If something feels confusing or rushed, what would you do?

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Closing the Conversation

Would it be helpful to keep a short list of phone numbers you trust?



Having trusted numbers written down makes checking easier.

You're not expected to remember everything.

Support is always allowed.



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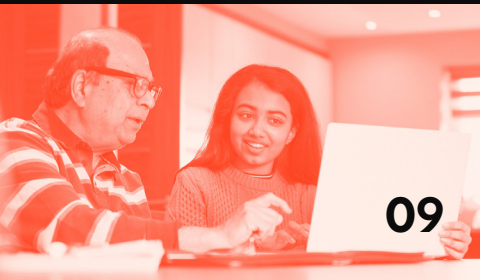
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Checking with Someone You Trust

When something feels urgent,
who do you usually check
with?



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Many people choose one trusted person to check with before acting on urgent requests.

In Islamic tradition, **Al Amin** means “*the trustworthy one*.” When something feels rushed, pause and ask: “*Did I check with my Al Amin?*”



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
