**FUISCE (Water of Life) 24.7**

Irish Whiskey is known as a gateway whiskey; its silky-smooth finish and subdued alcohol burn allows you to concentrate on the wonderful soft smokey flavors of these wonderful drams.

Suntory and Nikka – The two powerhouses of Japanese whisky distilling represented in four gorgeous drams. They might be rivals in business, but here they complement each other to perfection, displaying the delicate, floral flavors so distinct of Japan.

**TARTAN TINCTURES 34.5**

Scotland – Widely revered as the home of some of the best and oldest whisky distilleries in the world. This selection plays host to 4 of the most memorable distilleries around, showcasing the width and breadth of the heartland of whisky.

**IDYLLIC ISLAY 26.5**

Welcome to Islay (pronounced Eye-Lah), the home of peat. This flight brings both the earthy, peaty punch so distinctive of this tiny region, but doesn't shirk from the sweet, richer notes you may not have expected. With only eight distilleries to choose from, this island's drams are the gold standard for leaving a lasting impression, in all the best ways.

*Bruichladdich Classic Laddie, 50% - Kilchoman Machir Bay, 46% - Bowmore 12, 40%  
Caol Ila 12, 43%*

**HALLOWED HIGHLANDS 24.7**

The biggest region in Scotland boasts the widest selection of taste. From rich and sherried, to smokey oranges and peat, chocolate and blackberries, this flight has it all, including one of the oldest and most distinguished names in all of scotch.

*Royal Lochnagar 12, 43% - Ancnoc 12, 46% - Oban 14, 43% - Glenturret 10, 48.4%*

**SPLENDID SPEYSIDE 23.1**

With more distilleries within its borders than any other region of Scotland, it might seem a daunting challenge to figure out where to begin with Speyside. Luckily, we came up with something that, by our reckoning, hits all the right notes; most notably nutmeg, dried apricots, apples and a hint of shortbread.
